My beloved Lawrence Road friends and family:

Long, long ago, the prophet Jeremiah spoke these words into the pain and exile of God's people, a people who had lost everything, whose country had been overrun, whose city had been destroyed. Despite the context, they are words full of hope for the future. They are words of comfort and assurance. They are words meant for uncertain times, times of change when it is almost impossible, no matter how hard we try, to see over the horizon to what God has in store for us.

Our community, you and I, are in a place like that right now. I will be leaving this wonderful church and you amazing people on December 31 of this year, about 4 weeks from now. I don't know what comes next for me and Jim. This will be the first time in more than 24 years that I have not been leading worship on a Sunday morning. To say that I feel as if my anchor has come unhooked is to put it mildly.

And for you, you will be getting used to new voices, new ideas, new ways of proclaiming the gospel. It almost certainly will feel uncomfortable for a while. As members of my family sometimes say, *change is bad even when it's good*.

But God has plans for us. Like the ancients in exile in Babylon, we are going to have to sit with our discomfort and our dislocation for a season. But God has plans for us, plans for our welfare, plans for the good of the people who seek him. And in God's good time, to quote Julian of Norwich, all will be well, all will be will, and all manner of things will be well.

I thank you from the bottom of my heart for every blessing you have sent my way, for every prayer you have lifted on my behalf, for every smile, every high five, every holy hug. I treasure every pan of mac 'n' cheese I cooked, every giggle, every tear, even all the mornings that the boiler didn't come on. I treasure the times I have stood at the grave with you, the times that I baptized your babies, the times I helped you tie the knot, the Christmas Eves and the Easter mornings. Every moment of our journey has been God-breathed and I know myself to be the luckiest pastor on the face of the earth. I thank God that way back in September 2001, the co-chair of the Lawrence Road Presbyterian Church Pastoral Nominating Committee called me away from some pretty darned good fishing and asked me to stop by and have a chat.

So as we part ways, just hold fast to one another. Be patient with the process on which you are about to embark. It's not the world's quickest work (it is Presbyterian, after all.) But it's good and faithful work and I have every confidence that you will complete it successfully with all deliberate speed. Just keep your eyes lifted toward God and your hands outstretched to serve your neighbors and God will see you through.

Because God has a plan for the Lawrence Road Presbyterian Church, a plan for its welfare, a plan to give you a future with hope. I will pray for you every day. And I will never forget how much and how well we have loved one another.
