The English School is officially in the third week of the winter 2020 semester. Last semester seems far away. However, it was such a remarkable semester; I want to highlight two of The English School's accomplishments this past fall 2019.

Community Building

Approximately 61 students attended classes this fall. Out of those, 51 students attended 80 percent of their classes. This shows how committed our students are to learning English. We did our best to provide our students with extra resources. We collaborated with The College of New Jersey on three important initiatives. We are very grateful for all involved with the collaboration.

First, the English School relies on the support of volunteers to tutor our students for one-hour tutoring sessions on Thursday evenings. While we would like to offer a tutor for every student, we do not always have enough volunteers. Thanks to Professor Jean Wong, students in the graduate education program tutored our students during four out of the nine weeks of tutoring. This helped fill in the gap for our students who were not assigned a regular tutor.

Second, Wednesday Night Conversation hour is a wonderful opportunity for students to practice conversation in a safe, welcoming environment. Ideally, a smaller conversation group (one conversation leader to three or four students) gives each student time to practice conversation effectively. Again, thanks to Professor Jean Wong, we were able to offer smaller groups. Her students led conversation groups during four out of the ten conversation nights.

Third, we collaborated with Dr. Yifeng Hu, Professor of Communication. Dr. Hu and her students from the Intercultural Communications class created supplemental materials geared specifically for our students to achieve their English Learning goals. In addition, Dr. Hu's class helped us develop community-based resources for our students. This was a unique, community-building project.

Multi-Cultural Dinner


