Around the world, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. The three programs supported by **One Great Hour of Sharing** — Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People — all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope. OGHS is the single, largest way that Presbyterians come together every year to work for a better world, and we have been doing so since the end of World War 2 when OGHS was begun!

**PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (PDA)** receives 32% of the funds contributed. It works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and provides support for refugees around the world.

**PRESBYTERIAN HUNGER PROGRAM (PHP)** receives 36% of all contributions. PHP takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and address the systemic causes of poverty so that all may be fed.

**SELF-DEVELOPMENT OF PEOPLE (SDOP)** receives 32% of the funds contributed. SDOP invests in communities -- responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues.

Let’s set a goal of 100% participation at Lawrence Road Presbyterian. Every gift matters! You will find OGHS donation envelopes in the pews, and there are plenty of “fish” boxes to take home.

**Greetings! The English School is officially in the eighth week of the winter 2020 semester!** We are blessed. I am most excited about the number of volunteers who have been assisting our students this semester. In particular, I would like to highlight the success of **Wednesday Conversation Night**.

Wednesday night conversation was designed to give our students time to practice their speaking and listening skills in a relaxed environment. Heather Patel runs our Wednesday conversation night. Prior to becoming the Conversation Director, she was a long-time volunteer with the school. Heather is an amazing individual. She welcomes everyone to The English School community with a calm, caring manner. Her leadership is what keeps our volunteers and students coming each week. Her motto: *It will all work out.*

Thank goodness for Heather's motto because Wednesday night is busy! For the past several weeks, we have averaged twenty-nine students per week. The majority of conversation students come from our Monday night classes. However, some students do just register just for conversation so that they could practice English in a safe environment. With a high number of students, we need conversation leaders. Thanks to Heather, we average twelve conversation leaders per week. Our leaders comfortably interact with two to four students per conversation group. It is so uplifting to see the smiles and hear the laughter on Wednesday night.

Each week, I receive a message from someone with an interest in volunteering with us. Many of these requests are referrals from our English School community. For instance, I received a text from a young woman named Sarah, who is a recent graduate of Rider University. Sarah heard about our school from our lovely Bonner student, Michelle.
