Dear friends,

I can hardly believe it! The English School at the Lawrence Road Church is celebrating its 15th Anniversary as a powerful ministry of our church. And powerful is exactly the right word! Well over 1000 students have received high-quality low-cost English instruction. With over 400 volunteers, our immigrant neighbors have received individual tutoring and compassionate mentoring. Our highly educated and brilliant teachers have offered their gifts for English instruction as a blessing to the neighborhood. And best of all, so many of us, immigrant and native speaker alike, have become friends.

And it started like this:

The English School began in 2004 under the care and direction of Jessica Reeder Hurst and Gabriela Gill. Hurst had conceived of the school years earlier as a place for non-native speakers of English to not only learn English, but to also have a place to belong.

To that end, Jessica designed a program that would combine traditional classroom instruction, individualized help, and community building activities. English classes would be held on Monday nights, allowing working adults to attend classes despite their busy schedules. Individual tutoring would be held on Thursday nights, giving the students enough time to go home and work on their homework individually before returning to get help from a tutor. Social events would be held several times a semester, giving students a comfortable and safe place to practice their English and create additional ties to their community.

In order to offer individual tutoring to each student, it was necessary to recruit additional help. Jessica advertised for volunteer English tutors. The volunteer aspect of this program has always been critical to the goals and mission of the school, and also to its success. By bringing native speakers of English into the program as volunteers, we both increase the amount of English the students are able to access and we strengthen the bonds in our community between non-native speakers of English and native speakers of English.

In September 2004, the school opened its doors for the first time, welcoming 31 students and 22 volunteer tutors.

In the years since, the school has expanded its ministry, providing classroom instruction, conversation, tutoring, Bible study, and US Citizenship classes to as many as 170 students. The leadership and teaching staff have changed, too. But what has remained constant is Jessica's vision: that the school would be a place for non-native speakers of English to not only learn English, but to also have a place to belong.

Please join us on Thursday, April 4, 2019, beginning at 7pm, for an international buffet dinner and celebration of the goodness of God in and through 15 awesome years at the English School at the Lawrence Road Presbyterian Church.
