



# **DOG PARK**

## **RULES and ETIQUETTE**

- 🐾 Hours of Operation: Sunrise to Sunset**
- 🐾 Keep gates closed at all times.**
- 🐾 Dogs must be leashed while entering / exiting the park.**
- 🐾 Dogs must be removed from park at the first sign of aggression.**
- 🐾 Female dogs in heat and puppies under 4 months of age are not allowed in the park.**
- 🐾 Owners must remain inside with leash, within view and voice control of their dogs at all times.**
- 🐾 No more than 3 dogs per person and must be accompanied by person 18 years or older.**
- 🐾 Children and infants must be kept under strict supervision.**
- 🐾 All dogs must be legally licensed, current vaccinations and must wear a visible license tag.**
- 🐾 Smoking, eating and glass containers NOT permitted in park.**  
**NO treats - other dogs may sniff you looking for a treat.**
- 🐾 Make sure your dogs are hydrated, Bring water in plastic containers.**
- 🐾 Dogs instinctively fight for dominance. Know the difference between playful and aggressive behavior.**
- 🐾 Owners are responsible for injury to other dogs and / or damages to any portion of the park.**
- 🐾 Owners are responsible to pick up after their dogs and disposing of pet waste in designated containers.**
- 🐾 Don't be that person who thinks they got away without picking up because you didn't get caught. Be responsible.**
- 🐾 Use park at your own risk. Naples KOA shall not be liable for any injury or damage caused by any dog in the park.**
  
- 🐾 This is YOUR park. Keep it clean and neat for everyone to use and enjoy. We are happy to provide this area for you and your pets.**

# Naples KOA and KOA Official Pet Policy

KOA Campgrounds are pet friendly and welcome our guests who enjoy traveling and sharing their camping experience with the family dog and/or cat. Many campgrounds and State Parks do not allow pets due to the owners not following simple guidelines to assure a safe, healthy and enjoyable experience.

KOA Campgrounds are individually owned and operated and some campgrounds may have policies against accepting certain breeds that have been identified by our major insurance provider as having a history of unfriendly and aggressive behavior to other dogs and to humans. These breeds are Pit Bulls and Pit Bull mixes, Rottweilers and Dobermans. Inquire at the Office.

To insure all of our guests have the best experience, it is important that you read and abide by the following Naples KOA pet policy:

A. Your pet's vaccination certificate should be in your possession at all times in the event anything were to happen.

B. Aggressive dogs of any breed are not welcome at any KOA. If your dog shows behavior that is protective and unfriendly to strangers, please leave it home. If you decide to bring your dog and it exhibits this type of behavior the owner or management of the KOA will ask you to please find other camping accommodations.

C. All dogs are required to be under the control and visual observation of their owner at all times. **A 6' (six foot) leash rule is in effect** whenever the animal is outside the owner's camping trailer, vehicle, cabin, or motorhome. No dog should be left tied up and unattended outside the owner's camping equipment.

D. Allowing your pet to bark uncontrollably day or night will not be permitted and you may be asked to leave if you are not able to control your pet's barking behavior.

E. Pet rules unique to the location will be addressed at time of reservation or registration. We encourage all dog owners to call in advance to inquire about any specific rules that might apply to their situation. Some KOA Campgrounds do not allow pets in their Camping Kabins or have limited availability of pet units for rent. Please call in to inquire about availability for you and your pet.

F. Service dogs of any breed are welcome at all KOA Campgrounds. However, these animals must follow leash restraint policies and may not exhibit aggressive behavior.

**G. We do not tolerate pet owners that don't pick up after their dogs anywhere on the premises. We have 32 Doggy stations throughout the park. Use them or bring your own bags and dispose of it properly. Also, it is NOT OK to leave dog poop in the woods behind your site, any open area or on walking trails. It's a health and odor issue. Even in our open space. Think if you were walking your dog and stepping in poop! You MUST ALWAYS PICK UP after them. It's not an option - it's an obligation. It's your choice to have a dog. And your responsibility. If or when you are caught, you will be asked to leave. There are NO EXCEPTIONS to this rule. It's a health and safety issue.**
