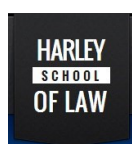

State Approval Regulations for Distance Education: A 'Starter' List

On October 29, 2010, the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) released the following new regulation for higher education institutions as "§ 600.9(c) State authorization"¹:

"If an institution is offering postsecondary education through distance or correspondence education to students in a State in which it is not physically located or in which it is otherwise subject to State jurisdiction as determined by the State, the institution must meet any State requirements for it to be legally offering postsecondary distance or correspondence education in that State. An institution must be able to document to the Secretary the State's approval upon request."

Institutions are expected to comply in each state in which they 'operate' by July 1, 2011. U.S. Department of Education officials [have told us](#) that institutions possessing proof that they are applying in a state by July 1 will be considered as 'good faith' that the institution is in compliance for the 2011-2012 year. We are waiting for the official release of this statement.

This is to acknowledge receipt of your survey responses regarding the need for licensure or program approval to offer on-line instruction to citizens in the State of Maine. As shared with you earlier, on-line instructional service providers, with no physical presence within the boundaries of the State of Maine, are not required to secure Maine licensure to operate as a proprietary school or to secure Maine State Board of Education authorization to operate in Maine as an approved degree-granting institution.

Given your affirmation that the institution you represent has no physical presence in this State it has been determined that Harley School of law LLC is exempt from State of Maine approval or authorization requirements to offer, or to continue to offer, its online instructional programming to citizens of this state.

The Juris Doctor (JD) is a professional doctorate degree in law. It is the degree required to practice law in the United States and many other countries.

The JD is typically a three-year program that covers a wide range of legal topics, including:

- Constitutional law
- Criminal law
- Contract law
- Property law
- Torts
- Civil procedure
- Legal writing and research

In addition to coursework, JD students also participate in moot court competitions, legal clinics, and other experiential learning opportunities.

After graduating from law school, JD holders must pass the bar exam in their state in order to practice law.

Firs year:

Civil Procedure, Torts, Contracts, Wills and estates, Property, Agency and partnership, Criminal Law, Constitutional Law, Corporations.

Second Year:

Evidence, Uniform Commercial Code, Criminal procedure, Professional responsibility, Administrative Law, Domestic Relations, Personal federal income tax.
