7:48 End of the year hive preparations: Brad Mogen spoke about "End of the Year Hive Preparations," beginning with pulling honey after August 15th, treating for mites, and then later applying a second mite treatment, perhaps oxalic acid. There was some discussion and questions regarding the "dribble method." Brad spoke about the need to protect hives by placing them out of the wind and wrapping them with waxed—cardboard covers or felt paper. He also said he uses candy boards to help his bees get through the winter. He spoke further about queen mating behavior, queen cell selection by worker bees and some of the implications for the hive.
