

Director Update

Impactful Partnerships

We have all heard the phrase "It's not what you know, it's who you know." Mark and I have made several key connections recently.

First, our local eye doctor came to the warehouse late last year to see what items we could ship to some villages in Guatemala where she was doing eye clinics.

After touring the warehouse and seeing our medical items, she asked if we had a place to go with all of them. We stated that these items come in faster than we can ship them and she got a look of excitement in her eyes.

She asked if we were willing to start a medical locker with these items. She was a member of Lions International, and they had several in the area that were extremely successful. We agreed and set the ball rolling.

We formed a partnership with the Lions groups in Kiel, New Holstein and Chilton to start the Tri-City Medical Locker. The Salvatorian Mission Warehouse provides the medical items and the space for the medical locker. The Lions clean and repair equipment and lend it out to people in our area.

Members of the Lions also volunteer at the warehouse two times per month and are on call for large projects and container loading. This partnership also led to volunteers helping from other groups such as the Knights of Columbus Kawanis and International.

Another important partnership we recently started is with 25: Ministries Matthew Cincinnati, OH. We decided to visit their facility on our way to KY to see if we could get some ideas of processes that we could make better at the warehouse.

Matthew 25 does similar work to what we do, except at a much larger scale. We were very impressed with their operations and how many people they are helping. Since our visit, we have started sharing items and ideas.

Both these partnerships have become essential to growing our impact. We are grateful for these connections.

LION'S TRI-CITY MEDICAL LOCKER

The Lion's Tri-City Medical Locker is our newest connection to the people closest to us - our local community!

The locker serves as a place for those that have a need for medical supplies such as wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches, toilet risers, commodes and so much more. The items are cleaned and repaired as necessary by the Lion's volunteers and readied for people to pick up. The Lions have normal weekly hours or can be called for emergency situations.

Reaching a little more outside of our local community, we also have partnerships with several food pantries across the state of Wisconsin. We mainly provide the pantries with small bags of cracker and pretzel sticks, as they are able to put them directly on the shelves and into the hands that need them.



MATTHEW 25: MINISTRIES



The mission of Matthew 25: Ministries is to fulfill Matthew 25:34-40 of the New Testament by providing nutritional food to the hungry, clean water to the thirsty, clothing to the naked, affordable shelter to the homeless, medical care to the ill, and humanitarian supplies to those in need.

After visiting Matthew 25: Ministries, we discovered how similar their needs are to ours. We reached out to them with a list of items we could share with them and they did the same with us. Since then, we have been shipping items back and forth with each other. It has become a great partnership.


To keep costs low, Matthew: 25 has a few in house manufacturing facilities, highlighted below.

Paint Reblending Program - takes unwanted or unused paint and reblends it to provide to areas in need of rehab / maintenance.

Notebook Manufacturing Center - takes bulk paper and creates notebooks for students in need.

Prasco Food Processing Center - creates dehydrated food packets to use in quick response to natural disasters worldwide - they can manufacture 5,000 packets a day!

We were extremely impressed with the system they have to dispatch people and supplies to victims of natural disasters throughout the country. They are ready at all times to be on location to help wherever needed.



Meet a volunteer!

Sr. Dora Zapf, SDS grew up in Germany. When Br. Regis sent the first container to Tanzania, she was at the receiving end. Soon after, she came to work at the Mission Warehouse. She remembers when the warehouse building didn't exist and they had to clean everything up each day in the space they used. When asked why she still volunteers at the Warehouse, she said because of the other volunteers.
