Taxes – Due September 30th with no Penalties. 2% penalties added on per month after due date. Final payment due December 31st before added to Arrears.

Utilities -

Payments due dates are as follows; March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31st. Penalties of 2% will be added to any overdue accounts and will be compounded over each month. The responsibility is on the owner to make sure that the bills are paid. You can contact the office during working hours to check on payment, or for any questions.

What Utility Payment Covers

Service: This payment covers the operation of the water plant on a yearly basis. This is so that when you get to the lake and turn the water on, you are able to use it. The operations include, water testing done 365 days a year (mandatory), chemicals to keep water drinkable, salaries for water operators, mailing costs for the testing (must be sent to Saskatoon), tools, and parts for the water plant operations.

Water Infrastructure Fee (WIF): this fee is for the maintenance & repairs of the water treatment plant building and any potential upgrades needed to the physical building itself.

Waste: this is the fee that was previously on your taxes. It was moved to the Utility as garbage collection is a utility and therefore cannot be on the taxes as a levy. This is the fee to cover staff wages, for this particular section, and Loraas disposal fee, which include the recycling fee.
