PRAYER

Prayer is an important aspect of our Church and the celebration of our Faith. We know that Jesus prayed throughout his ministry. We hear in the Gospels how he would often go and pray alone, and there were times he prayed in public. We follow Jesus' example and sometimes we pray publicly with others, such as at Mass, at meetings and other times. Sometimes we pray in the solitude of a special place in our home or somewhere else.

Recently, we celebrated the feast of St Bonaventure. St. Bonaventure was a Bishop, is a Doctor of the Church and even has a university named for him. He preached about the importance of prayer and was known for his dedication to prayer. We also have the example of St. Monica, whose feast we just celebrated. She is the mother of St. Augustine and prayed for his conversion to Catholicism. Her prayers were answered after many years, when Augustine joined the Catholic Church. Augustine became one of the great saints of our church and like St. Bonaventure, he is a Doctor of the Church. His feast is August 28, and Monica's feast day is August 27.

Generally, there are four purposes of prayer. These are:

- *Adoration: Acknowledging God's supreme dominion and excellence.
- *Thanksgiving: Expressing gratitude for God's blessings and grace.
- *Repentance: Confessing sins and seeking forgiveness.
- *Petition: Requesting something or help or guidance for oneself or others.

Two questions we should ask ourselves. How is my prayer life? I think most of us would say we're good at prayers of petition. How often do you pray thanking God for something other than at meals? What about praying in adoration? What about forgiveness? When was the last time we have asked God to forgive us for times when we have failed to live as Jesus taught us?

How can we improve our prayer life? Try to set a specific time or times of the day to pray, early morning, in the evening or just before we end our day. What else can we do to improve your conversations with God? More on this later.

St. Bonaventure's words below speak to us about the prayer and the possibilities of prayer. He tells us how prayer can help us in any situation in our life. (I've added the word person in parentheses)

"If you would suffer with patience the adversities and miseries of this life, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would obtain courage and strength to conquer the temptations of the enemy, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would mortify your own will with all its inclinations and appetites, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would know the wiles of Satan and unmask his deceits, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would live in joy and walk pleasantly in the ways of penance, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would banish from you soul the troublesome flies of vain thoughts and cares, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would nourish your soul with the very sap of devotion and keep it always full of good thoughts and good desires, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

If you would strengthen and keep up your courage in the ways of God, be a man (*person*) of prayer.

In fine', if you would uproot all vices from your soul and plant all virtues in their place, be a man (*person*) of prayer. It is in prayer that we receive the unction (blessing) and grace of the Holy Ghost (Spirit), who teaches all things."

A GROWING MISSION

And that is the story behind RVA Vocations Care (RVAVC), a newly created nonprofit that grew out of the work started by our Redeemer's Angels Vocations Committee.

RVA Vocations Care is separate from CDA- Redeemer's Angels, however, it will expand the mission that began here within our Court—reaching across the entire Diocese of Richmond.

This nonprofit is not replacing the amazing work already being done by our Redeemer's Angels Vocations Committee. Quite the opposite—it is growing out of that work.

Our Redeemers Angel's Vocations Committee will continue spiritually supporting seminarians through prayer and encouraging cards, as well as supporting the Poor Clares Monastery and the needs of the sisters.

RVA Vocations Care will build upon that foundation by providing spiritual and financial support for priests, seminarians, deacons and their families, and religious brothers and sisters throughout their vocational journey. It will also promote Community Care by bringing greater awareness, education, prayer, encouragement, and engagement about the importance of vocations throughout our Diocese.

One statement captures why this mission matters: "If we do not have priests, we do not have the Eucharist. Without the Eucharist, we do not have a Church."

RVA Vocations Care is about building on what started here in our court, expanding our reach, and helping people understand that vocations are everyone's responsibility.

STATE CDA WORKSHOP: *By Chris Lippman, CDA State Regent*

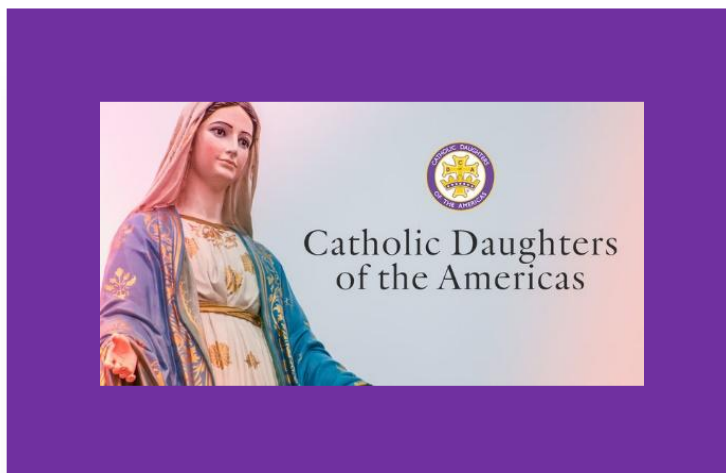

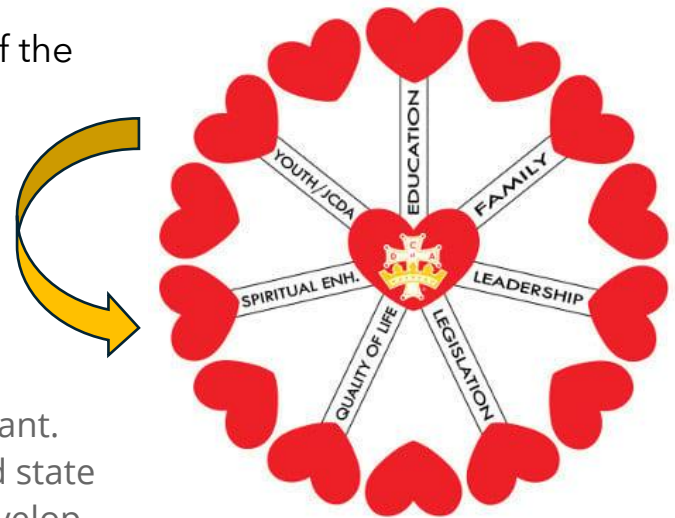

What if one simple act of prayer could change a life, maybe even a young person's vocation?

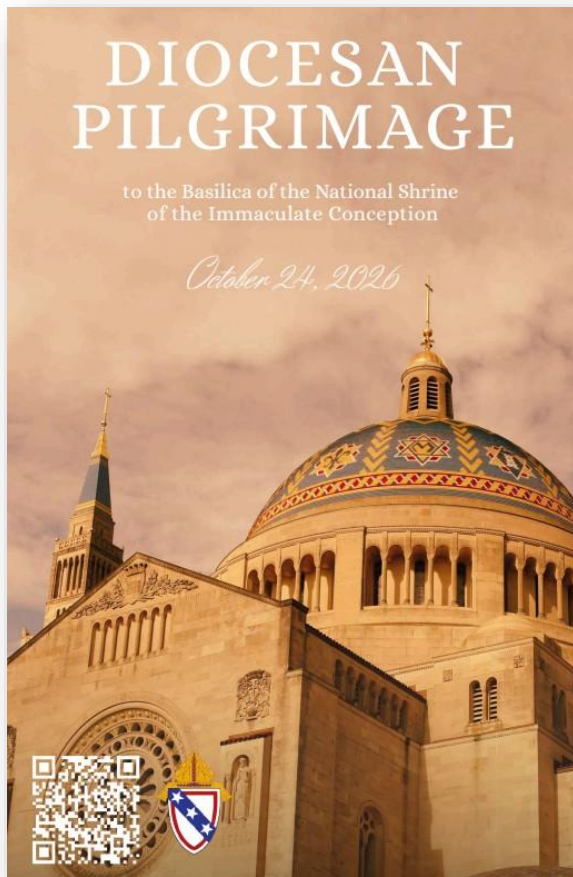
