NEWPORT HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL MIKE HUNTER NAMED DISTRICT'S ATHLETIC DIRECTOR





HISTORY OF NEWPORT HIGH SCHOOL STADIUM

The dedication of the Newport High School Stadium and the Municipal Recreation Field was held on September 22, 1939 before the Newport-Purcell football game. Dr. A.D. Owens, the Superintendent of Newport Schools was Master of Ceremonies. This site used to be called the "Taylor Mill Bottoms". Several years before this, it was a brush and weed overgrown strip of wasteland used by the city of Newport as a dumping ground.

In 1936, the Newport Board of Education sponsored a \$73,000.00 project. In 1937 the W.P.A (Works Progress Administration) constructed a concrete shell of the football stadium.

In 1938, the Newport City Commissioners joined the Newport Board of Education in a cost sharing agreement. This comprehensive recreational project was to be built by the Federal Public Works Administration (P.W.A.) This project included the following:

- Completion of the stadium (capacity of 4,500)
- Construction of a football field with lights
- ¼ mile running track
- Baseball Field with lights & grandstand (capacity of 1,000)
- Tennis Courts
 Wading Pool
 Playgrounds

Total Gross Cost was over \$115,000.00 P.W.A. Grant paid for over \$48,000.00

Newport Board of Education and the City split \$66,000.00 to pay the balance.

Under the Stadium were locker rooms, showers, restroom facilities, equipment storage rooms and a refreshment stand. The fields and buildings had sewage systems

with drainage and the entire area was fenced. Electrical experts said the football field was by far the best lighted field in Kentucky and one of the best in the United States. The baseball field at the time was larger than Crosley Field, the home of the Cincinnati Reds. The stadium, football field and running track are under control of the Newport Board of Education. All other facilities are under the control of the City of Newport.

Let's flash forward 83 years. Our Stadium is broken and needs to be fixed. 83 years of football, track & field and baseball, graduations and time has taken its toll. Many memories and stories from not only N.H.S. Alumni, but from our opponents. For many of us, a piece of our lives are there and always will be.

When the Newport Board of Education decides the fate of the stadium, the Newport High School Alumni & Associates Incorporated will keep you posted. In case you are interested, the Purcell Cavaliers won the football game defeating our wildcats 14-13.

NEWPORT BOARD OF EDUCATION STADIUM REPORT

Currently the stands and locker rooms at the Newport stadium have been temporarily closed as a safety precaution. The stadium has not been condemned, nor has the football field or the track. Water damage over the years has caused cracks in the superstructure concrete and may have created some possible unsafe conditions in the underneath areas. In a recent meeting with Newport Schools' Superintendent Tony Watts, he stressed the closure is precautionary and that student safety is the utmost concern. Although the stands and locker room areas have had multiple repairs over the years, water damage to the 1936 facility is considerable.

Ramona Malone, the Newport Board of Education Chairperson said the school board has commissioned an in-depth engineering study on the structure. The report, expected within the next few weeks, will detail the extent of the damage, possible repairs with cost estimates and a time frame for the work. If the damage is too great or too costly for repair, the Board will consider replacement. The Wildcat football team continues to practice on the field and will play a complete season this year. Our home games will be played at other area fields and the administration is finalizing the schedule now.

Superintendent Watts and Chairperson Malone both understand the history and love for this facility, yet the most important issue at the time is student safety. They thank everyone for their patience and support and have pledged to keep us updated on each step of this very important project.

NEWPORT WINS 1946 KENTUCKY STATE SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIP

Newport High School not only won the Northern Kentucky High School Swimming Championship IN 1946, but capped off the season by winning the Kentucky State High School Swimming Championship. Newport scored 32 points followed by Manual (23), Male (19) Madison (19) and Winchester (7).

The powerful Newport team won 4 of 7 events at Eastern Kentucky State Teachers College in Richmond, Kentucky. The Wildcats were State Champions in the 200 yard Freestyle Relay, 150 yard Medley Relay, 75 yard Breaststroke and 50 yard Freshman Freestyle.

Newport Head Coach MJ "Bud" Cavana took 11 swimmers to the State Championship. Team members included: Sid Besuner (3 titles), Peter Burris (2 titles), Bill Rawlings (2 titles), Jack Kerley (1 title), Merwin Dickerson (1 title), Ken "Moose" Jones, Joe Kohsin, Gordon Kohsin and Fred Minning, Bill O'Hearn and Don Whitehouse.



Newport High School student wins statewide competition and qualifies for Nationals

Newport High School graduating senior Brandon Harris placed first in a statewide competition for a striking T-shirt design featuring a stirring quote from famed boxer and Kentucky native Muhammad Ali. He plans to study pre-law at Northern Kentucky University, took first place honors at the 2022 SkillsUSA State Leadership and Skill Competition that was held April 13th through the 16th in Louisville.

Harris' T-shirt features an outline of Ali with one of his famous motivational quotes, "Don't count the days, make the days count," along with the SkillsUSA logo. The shirt also had to represent Kentucky or Louisville in the design. The design really captured a lot of what SkillsUSA is all about."

SkillsUSA is a national career and technical student organization serving more than 395,000 high school, college and middle school students enrolled in training programs in trade, technical and skilled service occupations.

Harris has been a student in the Newport High School Career and Technical Education Print Technology program for four years. "The print tech program is excellent at Newport," Harris said. "I learned to use software to make the SkillsUSA logo and design the T-shirt." He traveled to Atlanta to compete in the SkillsUSA Nationals, which were held June 20-24.






