Through intentional dialogue and hands-on practice, students were equipped with practical tools to navigate conflict, strengthen peer relationships, and lead with confidence.

The i-MPACT | i-LEAD Foundation delivered an engaging EQed Peer Conflict Mediation Session to the Campus Ambassadors at Carencro High School. The session focused on helping student leaders understand the role of emotional intelligence in conflict resolution and peer-to-peer communication.

Students explored core EQed concepts, including:

- Recognizing emotions in themselves and others
- Managing emotional responses during conflict
- Active listening and perspective-taking
- Using respectful language to de-escalate situations
- Making responsible, relationship-centered decisions

Campus Ambassadors participated in interactive discussions, real-life scenarios, and guided reflection, allowing them to practice mediation strategies they can apply within their school environment.



Student Leadership in Action

Throughout the session, students demonstrated strong engagement, insight, and a willingness to reflect on their own communication styles. The experience reinforced their role as peer leaders and mediators, empowering them to model empathy, accountability, and problem-solving among their classmates. By strengthening emotional awareness and conflict-resolution skills, the EQed Peer Mediation Session supports the development of a more connected, respectful, and emotionally safe campus culture.
