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Lorain County Siblings Will Instruct the Next Generation of Technology Leaders

(Lorain, Ohio) – Oberlin High School graduates David Payne (Class of 2017) and Cameron Payne (Class of 2018) have been hired by TECH CORPS to educate, excite and empower Lorain County students this summer. “I hope to inspire high school students to pursue technology careers,” explained Cameron Payne. “As technology evolves, there are many new technology careers available, and I want to help kids like me be prepared for those jobs.”
