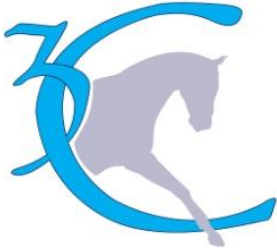

Rules: ** Horse and rider qualification as per BRC Rule Book 2024

Dressage - Bridle number to be worn on both sides of the bridle/saddlecloth
Combined Training & Show Jumping – Bib numbers to be worn for Jumping phase

The passport/influenza record for each horse must be brought to the competition
As maybe spot checked on the day.

All hats must be tagged and will also be checked.

Hay, droppings and all rubbish must be removed from the showground, the land is grazed by livestock.

Dogs to be kept on leads at all times.

All classes will be run under the BRC rules.

LONDON AND SOUTH EAST CHAMPIONSHIP RULES 2024

1. GENERAL RULES

- a) The London & South East Championship comprise a number of inter-Area team competitions for riding clubs within BRC Areas 6, 10, 11 and 13.
- Dressage, Combined Training, Show Jumping to which the rules below apply.

- b) Where not specified below, rules for the championship are as per the current British Riding Clubs Members Handbook. If a rule is not covered by the current BRC Handbook, the relevant discipline rule book will be referred to. *It is up to the individual Clubs to bring these rules to the notice of their competitors.*

At all L&SE championships 'protective headwear' (as defined in the current BRC Members Handbook) must be worn at all times when mounted and must show a visible current hat tag. Competitors are responsible for ensuring their hat meets the required standard.

- c) Team competitions will be for teams of three or four (with the best three scores to count). Where a club team cannot provide at least a team of three for the competition, they may approach other clubs in order to field an Area team.
- d) In the event of any horse or rider being found to be ineligible, they will be disqualified. For a team of four with one disqualified combination the results will be re-calculated to remove the disqualified combination score. For a team of three with one disqualified combination the team will be eliminated but the other team members can continue as individuals. As BRC Rules.
- e) It is a condition of entry that each Club agrees to provide **one helper per club** unless otherwise stated by the organising Area. Full contact details of each helper (name, address, e-mail and telephone number) must be given on the appropriate form. Helpers must be prepared to assist in any discipline as required. They will be notified as to the time when they will be required. Clubs not producing the necessary helper may not be allowed to compete. Your allocated job can be rotated within your club.
- f) In the event of the Championships being cancelled a percentage of the entry fees will be kept to cover administrative and cancellation costs as set out in the championship schedule.
- g) Protests or complaints to be made in writing to the organiser accompanied by a deposit of £20.00. Protests must be made no later than 30 minutes after the incident which gave rise to that protest, 30 minutes after the results have been published or, in the case of protests against qualification of horse or rider, 60 minutes after the start of the class. At the Championship, the Committee to deal with an objection will consist of at least two Area Chairs or their nominated representatives plus the Official Steward of the event concerned and their decision will be final. The deposit will be forfeited unless the protest is upheld or it was decided that there were good and reasonable grounds for lodging the protest.
- h) Substitutions of horses and/or riders are allowed at the championship. All substitutes must be equally eligible on the date of the Championship.
- i) Competitors should note that if the same competitor appears at the Championship in Show Jumping and also the Pure Dressage and/or the Combined Training, they may have to jump before riding their dressage test.
- j) **PRIZES AT THE CHAMPIONSHIP** Rosettes to the first six teams and first eight individuals in each arena in each discipline. Perpetual trophies to the winning team in each discipline. The Natasha Trophy will be presented to the Club with the best overall performance. TROPHIES WILL ONLY BE PRESENTED IF THEY HAVE BEEN BROUGHT BACK.

2. ELIGIBILITY

ALL DISCIPLINES as per the current BRITISH RIDING CLUBS RULE BOOK EXCEPT

- a) Competitors must be members of an affiliated British Riding Club within Areas 6, 10, 11 and 13. Teams may be any combination of one junior and/or senior members.
- b) Horses/ponies must be at least 4 years old.
- c) No rider may compete for more than one Club during the year in the London & South East Championship.
- d) Horses are limited to THREE classes at the Championship.
- e) Downgrading allowed as per BRC Handbook for the relevant discipline.

3. SHOW JUMPING – AS BRC RULES – 1 Junior per team allowed

- a) 70cm = 0 BE or BS points. 80cm = 5 BE or 75 BS points. 90cm = 20 BE or 500 BS points.
- b) Each team member will jump one round (single phase) with the best three scores in each round to count for the team total.
- c) Team members will also compete as individuals at the championship.
- d) Order of Jumping – **times will be allocated. The members of each team jump one after the other.**

4. DRESSAGE – 1 Junior per team allowed

- a) **Dressage will be run as BRC Rule Book 2024.**
- b) **Prelim: unlimited prelim points up to 35 points at novice, 0 points at Elementary or above. Rider must not have gained BHS stage 4 coach or above in the past 10 years.**
- c) **Nov: unlimited novice points up to 35 elementary points, 0 points at Medium or above**

5. COMBINED TRAINING – 1 Junior per team allowed

- a) **The dressage test may be commanded and whips may be carried at the Championship. Spurs are allowed.**
- b) **The time allowed for the show jumping phase will be based on a speed of 325mpm. Every commenced period of 1 second in excess of time allowed will be penalised by 1 time penalty. All jumping penalties will be as per the BRC Handbook for combined training.**
- c) **Prelim & 70cm – unlimited prelim points, up to 35 novice points, 0 points at elementary and above. Horses may be registered with BE but must not have any BE points. Not have completed a BE 100 or above in the current or previous calendar year.**
- d) **Novice & 80cm – no restrictions.**
