



SIR HOUSE VISITOR RULES

To ensure the safety and well-being of the women in residence, the following rules shall be enforced at all times.

***All persons on property agree to adhere to these Rules.
Violation of any rule may result in loss of visitation privileges.***

SISTERS IN RECOVERY reserves the right to remove any person from the premises for non-compliance.

All visitors must be pre-approved by the House Manager or a Board Member.

Family or friends not involved in 12-Step recovery may visit a specific resident on the first Sunday of each month for two hours between 10:00am-4:00pm. Exceptions may be made for holidays or birthdays or special occasions at Board discretion.

Female friends in 12-Step programs and sponsors are exempt from this restriction, but may not visit past 9:30pm on any day without permission from a Director or Board Member.

Parents/Guardians are solely responsible for their children's behavior and safety at all times and are required to be in their presence at all times.

Adult male visitors and same-sex partners are not allowed inside the house or garage for any reason. Male family members may visit outdoors in the patio area. Male platonic friends or boyfriends may not access the property beyond the parking lot.

Platonic or family female visitors and minor children are allowed in common areas only: living room, kitchen, restroom and outdoors.

No visitors are allowed to enter any resident's bedroom for any reason.

All visitors assume responsibility for their own safety and security while on premises.

Sisters In Recovery will not be responsible or liable for any lost, damaged or stolen personal property nor any accident or injury caused on behalf of a resident's or other visitor's negligence.

All persons on property are expected to display appropriate respectful behavior to the women in residence, staff, and other guests.

The following specific behaviors will result in immediate removal from the premises:

- Being under the influence or in possession of alcohol, drugs or any mind-altering substance
- Solicitation of alcohol, drugs or any mind-altering substance
- Derogatory or disparaging remarks about Sisters In Recovery operations, policies, procedures, staff or residents
- Sexual remarks, advances or behavior
- Vandalism
- Theft
- Inappropriate or revealing attire
- Solicitation of funds for any outside cause
- Distribution of religious, business, or political flyers, signs, pamphlets, books, etc.
- Any conduct considered unacceptable by reasonable standards
- Any action that may be a detriment to Sisters In Recovery, its guests, or the women who reside on the property
