A red kite soars gracefully over the gardens in Lower Woodford. Photograph taken on 30 June 2025 by Nigel Wood - member Royal Photographic Society. The photograph is printed on fine art Hahnemuhle paper at 16 by 12 inches, framed.

In the 1990s, the red kite - once persecuted to near-extinction in Britain - was successfully reintroduced through a pioneering conservation program. Careful monitoring, protection and support allowed the population to grow rapidly, turning the project into one of the UK's most celebrated conservation successes. Today, red kites are once again a common sight in many parts of England, including here in the Woodford Valley.
