

Notice to employees on proposition 65

Like all businesses in California, our business is subject to the safe drinking water and toxic enforcement act of 1986. Commonly known as proposition 65. The key provisions of this law:

- 1) Require businesses exposing any individual to list chemicals to warn the individual; and
- 2) Prohibit discharging list of chemicals into any source of drinking water.

Proposition 65 exposure warning

How many chemical exposures are associated with industrial activities, every day items, even the air we breathe in the food we eat. routinely contain proposition 65 list of chemicals. These chemicals are listed for one or more hazard characteristics: chemicals known to the state of California to cause cancer and chemicals known to the state of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. This notice provides information and warning specific to exposures that you will encounter at this Business. In many instances, we do not have information specific to this business location. Instead, we have relied upon the experts in the field to tell us where proposition 65 exposures may occur.

Motor vehicle related exposures

Gasoline and diesel engine exhaust contain chemicals listed under proposition 65 list of chemicals including benzene and carbon monoxide. Enclosed or partially enclosed spaces, such as service bays, garage is, or parking structures can concentrate exhaust fumes, increasing exposure to these chemicals. At this business exposure to engine exhaust is likely, both indoor and out, due to the presence of engine exhaust in the ambient air from operations, adjacent streets, and parking areas. In addition, many vehicle components and replacement parts, vehicle fluids, touchup paint, and materials used to service vehicles contain listed chemicals, including, but not limited to- fuel, oil, batteries, brakes, and wheel balancing weights. When you operate, service, clean, or maintain a motor vehicle you will generate and be exposed to Lista chemicals contained in used oil, waste fluids, fumes, Greece, grime, and particles from components wear.

Secondhand tobacco smoke

Tobacco smoke is a list of chemicals and it also contains many chemicals that are known to cause cancer and/or birth defects or other reproductive harm. Smoking is prohibited while on duty. But it may still be permitted in certain areas of exposure such as work site locations.

Furnishings, office supplies, and electrical components.

Office furnishings, including furniture, carpeting, power cords, computers, printers, copiers, and carbonless paper, contain a number of proposition 65 list of chemicals, including lead, formaldehyde, and acetaldehyde. These lists of chemicals are known to the state of California to cause cancer and/or birth defects and other reproductive harm. In addition, various common items made of brass such as keys or plastics may expose you to the list of chemicals.

First aid supplies

Certain first aid supplies, such as pain relievers and stomach coating medication, that contain aspirin, pink bismuth, attapulgate, and/or petroleum jelly, will expose you to proposition 65 list of chemicals.

Food and beverages

Food and snacks are sold in vending machines and by food vendors in an area that may be provided from time to time. Frying or baking foods at high temperatures produces acrylamide in certain foods, such as chips and french fries. Broiling or barbecuing meats and fish produces chemicals listed under proposition 65 list of chemicals that can cause cancer. Chocolate and other natural ingredients of foods contain trace amounts of listed chemicals including lead. Drinking alcoholic beverages is not permitted during working hours and may increase cancer risk and health hazards during pregnancy that may lead to birth defects.

Warning

All areas of this business and offsite locations contain chemicals known to the state of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals are contained in vehicles and parts and accessories offered for sale and within some of the products and materials used to maintain the property, and in the emissions, fumes, and smoke from business operations, employee and guest activities, including, but not limited to, the operation and servicing of motor vehicles, and the exposures to or use of tobacco products.

To minimize your exposure to proposition 65 chemicals, we urge you to follow all manufacturer instructions pertaining to proper use of motor vehicles, vehicle components, materials, and supplies. If you have a question about a particular activity, please contact your supervisor for material safety data sheets or other information. Always wear proper Personal Protective Equipment for the task you are assigned, Frequently wash your hands; especially before eating or touching your face and eyes..
