As we move forward, we want to assure everyone that we will continue to provide access to vital services and serve as a conduit to valuable community resources.

- Total Recipients Served (2002-2024): 2,353
- Total Volunteer Hours Provided (2002–2024): 166,201

#### **Our Services**

Caring and trained volunteers assist program recipients with the following:

- Appointment Escort: A friendly support person to accompany recipients to medical appointments or meet them there
- Correspondence Assistance: Help with paying bills, writing letters, and completing forms
- **Errands:** Assistance with grocery shopping, picking up prescriptions, and purchasing essential items
- Handyman/Yard Work: Minor home repairs, installations, and seasonal yard maintenance
- Referral Services: Connecting recipients to additional resources and services
- **Technology Mentorship:** Guidance on using electronic devices, such as smartphones, tablets, and computers
- **Telephone Reassurance:** Regular check-in calls to reduce isolation and maintain social connections
- **Transportation:** Rides to medical appointments, grocery stores, and other essential destinations
- Miscellaneous Requests: Services considered on a case-by-case basis

#### **Eligibility for Services**


Prospective care recipients must meet the following criteria:

- Reside in Latrobe, Unity Township, Derry, Derry Township, Ligonier, or Ligonier Township
- Be 60 years or older
- Request services offered by the program
- Complete and sign an application for service

Program recipients can receive up to two hours of service per week, completely free of charge.

#### **Local Statistics**

LAIVC provides free, volunteer-led services that meet key wellness needs of older adults, such as social connection, daily structure, and independence. By offering services like telephone reassurance calls, transportation, and grocery shopping, LAIVC reduces the need for paid assistance while keeping local seniors connected and supported, enhancing their overall quality of life.

#### **Did You Know?**

- A round-trip Uber ride to the doctor's office in Westmoreland County, PA, costs about \$18 to \$40.
- Instacart delivery fees range from \$3.99 to \$7.99, with service fees of 5-10% and optional tips of \$5 to \$10, bringing the total to \$10 to \$20 per delivery (excluding grocery costs).

On average, services like transportation and grocery shopping save recipients over \$1,000 annually, offering essential relief to seniors on fixed incomes. These savings also create a long-term investment in the community's future, as aging impacts everyone—whether it's your parents, siblings, or even yourself. Supporting these services now helps build a stronger, more connected community for years to come.

#### **Volunteer Opportunities**

Volunteering with Hearts and Hands Helping Seniors is a meaningful way to give back and make a lasting impact in our community. Our dedicated volunteers span all ages—retirees, families, students, professionals, and even program recipients—each bringing compassion and a willingness to help. - Position program services as essential support for the aging community


#### **Financial Sustainability**



#### **Community Benefit Organization**



A remarkable return on investments!

Each year, the Independent Sector—a coalition of nonprofits, foundations, and corporate giving programs—calculates the value of a volunteer hour. According to The NonProfit Times (April 23, 2024), the value of a volunteer hour increased by 5.3% in 2024, reaching an estimated \$33.49 per hour.

Using this value, the 9,308 volunteer hours contributed in 2024 by Hearts and Hands Helping Seniors (LAIVC) equates to a remarkable Community Benefit Organization (CBO) value of \$311,725.

Since the program's inception, LAIVC volunteers have provided an astounding 166,697.75 hours of service. When multiplied by the 2024 value of a volunteer hour, this effort represents an aggregated dollar value of \$5,582,708.

These incredible statistics highlight the monumental impact of LAIVC's volunteers, whose unwavering dedication and acts of kindness make a profound difference in the lives of those we serve. Their contribution exemplifies the heart and strength of a true community benefit organization.
