In 2023, our programs achieved remarkable milestones:

- 305 Recipients served
- 212 Volunteers mobilized
- 9,835 Volunteer hours contributed
- 4,902 Services provided

### **Donor Bill of Rights**

We all receive so many requests for donations each year. It is difficult to decide which organization to support. We want to ensure that you have full confidence when donating to Hearts and Hands Helping Seniors—Laurel Area Faith in Action. We want to share with you the Donor Bill of Rights we live by when making decisions for our organization.

- 1. To be informed of the organization's mission, of the way the organization intends to utilize donated resources, and of it's capacity to use donated resources for their intended purposes.
- 2. To be informed of the identity of those serving on the organization's governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- 3. To have access to the organization's most recent financial statements.
- 4. To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- 5. To receive appropriate acknowledgment and recognition.
- 6. To be assured that information about their donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
- 7. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
- 8. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers or employees of the organization.
- 9. To be ensured that their name and information included in mailing list will not be shared.
- 10. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.

In short: be scrupulous!

Here are 10 lessons we can learn from a snowflake:


- 1. **Embrace Your Uniqueness** No two snowflakes are alike, and neither are we. Celebrate what makes you different—it's what makes you special.



### 10-Minute Vegetable Pantry Soup

Cook Time 10 mins Total Time 10 mins

If you need a recipe that's 100% from the pantry, you can omit the onion and garlic, or substitute minced or dehydrated onion and garlic.




### **Ingredients**

1 T. olive oil	1 can diced tomatoes. DO NOT DRAIN		
1 large onion, diced	I can navy beans or chickpeas. Drained and rinsed		
2 cloves garlic, minced	1 can sliced carrots, drained		
1 t Italian seasoning	1 can cut green beans, drained		
1/4 t ground sage	1 can sliced mushrooms, drained		
1 quart chicken, beef, or vegetable broth	**You can add other canned vegetables that you have on hand. Corn, peas, and diced potatoes are great additions. Make sure to drain them.		
1 c 100% vegetable juice **If you do not have this, you can substitute the liquid from the canned vegetables	Salt and pepper to taste		
2 t red wine vinegar **You can use any type of vinegar you have on hand.	***You can add canned chicken or beef to this. Make sure to drain before adding.		

### **Instructions**

- 1. Heat the oil in large saucepan over medium-high heat.
- 2. Add the onion and sauté until transparent, about 2 minutes.
- 3. Add the garlic, Italian seasoning, and sage and cook 10 seconds.
- 4. Add the broth, vegetable juice and vinegar, and bring to boil.
- 5. Add the tomatoes, navy beans, carrots, green beans, and mushrooms. This is where you would add any additional canned vegetable you have on hand. Let soup simmer for 4 to 5 minutes.
- 6. Season to tase with salt and pepper.
- 7. Enjoy!






# BOARD OF DIRECTORS
