One call, one ride, one piece of mail, one gift...this may sound simple and nothing noteworthy. But to the recipients of these "Ones" they make all the difference in the world.

The uncertain economic times that are facing our nation have also had a detrimental effect on the non-profit sector of our society. We know that the struggles are real. When we come together as the collective "one" caring for our neighbors the burden is lighter and the blessings are multiplied.

Services

Laurel Area Faith in Action addresses the issues of isolation, loneliness, and basic needs. Working with local churches, schools, businesses, organizations, agencies, and individuals, Laurel Area Faith in Action connects volunteers with program recipients. Volunteers provide care and compassion to recipients through a variety of services. The way some services are delivered has been changed to meet CDC safety protocols. The intent of the program is to complement existing community services, not replace or compete with them.

Caring Volunteers are trained to assist elderly individuals with the following:

- **Appointment Escort** a friendly support person to meet the recipient at doctor appointments or go with them
- Caregiver Relief* much needed 1-2 hour breaks for full-time caregivers
- Correspondence help with paying bills, writing letters, completing forms
- Errands picking up prescriptions, groceries, toiletries
- Friendly Visitor* weekly friendly visits to talk, share interests, discover music
- Handyman/Yard work minor repairs, installations, yard work, as needed
- **Referral Services** link to other services in the community
- **Technology Mentor** help with cell phone, computer, e-Reader, cable remote
- **Telephone Reassurance** monthly calls to reduce isolation and remain connected
- **Transportation** rides to the store, doctor, medical tests, etc.
- **Miscellaneous** service requests taken on a case-by-case basis

Prospective Care Recipients requesting services qualify as follows:

- Live in Latrobe, Unity Township, Derry, Derry Township, Ligonier and Ligonier Township areas AND
- Aged 60 years and older AND
- Request services offered by the Program AND
- Complete and sign an application for services

Care Recipients can expect to receive an average of up to 2 hours of service a week. All services are provided FREE of charge.

*Caregiver Relief and Friendly Visitor services are provided on a very limited basis due to continued COVID concerns.

Summary of Program Services

Provide Services to Meet the Needs of Community

Laurel Area Faith in Action currently has approximately 500 recipients and approximately 400 volunteers counting long-term as well as episodic volunteers. During 2022 there were more than 12,320.75 total volunteer hours provided during 4704 times of service. The impact of these numbers is staggering on the quality of life of the recipients.



Volunteer Recruitment

Laurel Area Faith in Action has remained active in the communities we serve and are always seeking additional avenues of volunteer recruitment. We have been actively seeking opportunities to reach out into our communities, speaking at area churches, school, businesses, and organizations sharing the available opportunities for volunteering. It is imperative that we continue to share the mission and vision of Laurel Area Faith in Action. We are thankful for the amazing volunteers who continue to give of themselves to help others.

Elder Abuse Task Force

Laurel Faith in Action joined the countywide task force in late 2016. This task force brings together professionals from the community at large to educate and protect aging residents from physical and emotional abuse, neglect, cyber scams and financial exploitation. Education and awareness campaigns are conducted throughout the year.

Strategic Planning

The staff and Board of Directors continued the process of strategic planning to sustain and grow the Laurel Faith in Action Program. According to an article published in *The Chronicle of Philanthropy* on June 14, 2022, the uncertain economy and rising prices are indicators that challenges are on the horizon for most non-profits, and Laurel Area Faith in Action is not exempt. The Board of Directors, the Executive Director, and staff are working closely monitoring changes. We are taking a proactive approach through the creation of various specialized groups to plan and implement strategies to maintain a positive philanthropic position. Specific areas are fundraising, easy donation of stocks and bonds, legacy donations, as well as seeking new grant opportunities. We are also seeking additional ways to reach our targeted demographic. This includes a marketing plan as well as a new and expanded community outreach plan. Looking forward, we continue our commitment to provide the much-needed services and inter-personal communication that is essential for maintaining good quality of life.

Community Connection

Laurel Area Faith in Action depends on the partnerships with many area organizations, churches, schools, foundations, as well businesses and individuals. No one person can do everything. The connection with the community is the heart of our organization.

Together we will!

- Excela Health Care System The partnership with Excela Health continues as we both work for the improved health and wellness of our community. Excela Health sponsors the "Faith in Action" monthly radio show airing the fourth Saturday of the month at 8:30 a.m. on Westmoreland Gold 1480 AM or 98.7 FM.
- Latrobe Area Hospital Charitable Foundation Beginning in 2005, Laurel Area Faith in Action has received funding from this foundation. We are extremely appreciative of the continued support.
- Adelphoi Village The collaboration with group homes at Adelphoi Village has been a tremendous success and the relationship continues to grow. Supervised youth cut grass, rake leaves, and shovel snow for more than 40 elderly homeowners year-round in the Greater Latrobe area. Since the work began with Adelphoi group homes in 2003, ten group homes have provided over 26,942 hours of service!
- Saint Vincent College Since 2002, the program has worked with the college and students who help with household chores, yard work, friendly visits, as well as helping with socialization activities at area nursing homes and senior living facilities.
- Saint Vincent Seminary Seminary students are enrolled in an ongoing practicum program with Laurel Area Faith in Action where they earn credit and gain pastoral experience. We are looking forward to the continuation of this program. Seminary students are paired with a recipient, and they meet on a weekly basis.
- United Way of Westmoreland County Day of Caring Employees from local businesses participate through the United Way and directly with the Program to provide projects that directly help recipients remain living in their homes.
- Elder Abuse Task Force The program serves on the countywide initiative to "reduce the number of victimized older adults through prevention, education, identification, and prosecution through a joint effort."
- Latrobe Presbyterian Church donates office space for staff and meeting space for Board and volunteer meetings.
- Senior Employment Program (SEP), Westmoreland County Community College provides paid office staff who work on-site 16-20 hours per week; Laurel Faith in Action has been a training site since 2002.
- Unity Township Supervisors, Derry Township Supervisors, and City of Latrobe staff pick up hundreds of bags of raked leaves from recipients' homes and provide financial and other support.
- Thank you to all the others that provide volunteer services throughout the year. Even though not each individual community group is listed, your service and commitment are greatly appreciated.

Leaf Raking – Since 2002, leaf raking has been an annual event in the Laurel area. The 2022 was challenging. The leaves stayed on the trees late into the season. Then weather played havoc with our group's plans. Each group was assigned to a particular recipient's home, and they would work out a day that worked for each of them. Unfortunately, rain storms and snow storms on several weekends changed some of the scheduled days. We asked that all the raking be completed as soon as possible. We had approximately 100 volunteers raking at the homes of 18 recipients. Many of the leaves were collected by the municipalities of Unity Township, Latrobe, Ligonier, and Derry.

United Way Week of Caring – This is an annual event where teams from area businesses sign up to provide assistance to the aging members of our population. These teams are then matched with a recipient who has a need that matched the teams skills.

Thanksgiving Outreach Event – Thanksgiving booklets were sent to each of our recipients to share how thankful we are that they are part of the Faith in Action family. The booklets included a card, puzzles, riddles, and coloring pages. We received wonderful feedback on these booklets that were sent to about 300 people.

Advent Project – Christmas is not what is under the tree, but what is in our hearts. Each year, with the help of our Advent Angels, the hearts of Faith in Action recipients and local nursing home residents are full at Christmas.

Throughout the year, volunteers work to provide each recipient with handmade Christmas gifts. These include volunteers who sew, knit and crochet. Last year's gifts were handsewn neck pillows and crocheted top kitchen towels. Once our volunteers have these beautiful creations complete, the rest of our angels get to work. Students from St. Vincent college, Children from Charter Oak Church Sunday School and Youth Group, as well as many other talented youth make hand drawn gift bags and Christmas Cards. Last year, Saint Vincent College Career Center helped decorate the card envelopes. Various community supporters and local businesses donated items to fill the bag including candy and calendars. Last year, Latrobe's Great American Banana Split pageant participants spent time helping to fill the candy bags.

So much love is put into this volunteer outreach initiative from start to finish. We want everyone to feel loved and remembered always, especially at the holidays. Our Advent Angels make that happen each year!

Advent bags were delivered to 497 recipients by staff and our Advent Angel Volunteers. This year we expanded our outreach to include gift bags to Gables, gift bags to The Grove, and gift bags were delivered to Kelly's for both the Latrobe and Greensburg locations, gift bags were also delivered to the residents of the National Church Residence located on Weldon Street. Our amazing advent angel crafters made 544 towels, and 675 pillows that were given to each recipient. LESCO Federal Credit Union sponsored the 2023 Calendars that were included in each gift bag.

The response to this year's advent project gift bags was overwhelming. We received many cards, letters, and calls expressing appreciation for the wonderful gift bag from the heart, but also for being remembered. So many of our recipients do not have family, and the gift they receive from us is sometimes the only gift they receive. Our delivery angels shared the joy and appreciation they received as they made their rounds.

Planning for 2023 is already in motion. Each recipient received a Valentine activity book in February. March celebrates a kick-off brunch for our Advent Crafters. Hand-crafted Easter cards is the outreach for April. May hosts our annual Community Event celebrating our 21st year. The theme for 2023 is *The Kentucky Derby*. Laurel Area Faith in Action has many other events and activities on the horizon for 2023.

Funding

Laurel Area Faith in Action continues to be blessed by the generosity of spirit and donations from many local organizations and individuals. Income reported in the Annual Report is based on a *cash basis* while the financial reports are based on an *accrual accounting basis*. Donors – Laurel Area Faith in Action was blessed by the generosity of 367 donors during 2022. The year 2022 continued to be like no other in the history of Laurel Faith in Action. Uncertain economic times and rising prices presented challenges to donation efforts. The continued philanthropic generosity of those who support Laurel Faith in Action did not waiver. We had many "God-bump" occasions during this year which we are greatly thankful for. Participant Demographics 2022


Adult Volunteers -

Care Recipients -

- 40 New recipients
- The majority of our care recipients are between the ages of 71-90.
- Average Length of Stay in the program is 70 months.
- During 2022, 52 of our recipients died.
- Referrals to the program are by word of mouth from friends, family, volunteers and churches. We also receive referrals from service agencies and organization, outreach activities, social media, and marketing.

Remarkable return on investments!

Each year, the *Independent Sector*, a coalition of nonprofits, foundations, and corporate giving programs, calculates the Value of a Volunteer Hour. According to *The Non-Profit Times*, published April 18, 2022, the value of a volunteer hour jumped almost 5% reaching an estimated \$29.95 per hour in 2022, up \$1.41 from the \$28.54 per hour rate reported for 2021. At this value per hour, the volunteer hours for Laurel Faith in Action have a value of \$369,006.46. The total hours of volunteer service that has been provided by Laurel Area Faith in Action from the beginning of the program through the end of 2022 is an incredible 147,059.75 hours. Multiplying these numbers by the value of volunteer hour of \$29.95 places the aggregated dollar value at \$4,404,439.51! The staggering impact of these volunteer statistics is by far a significant contribution showing the amazing acts of kindness provided by the Laurel Area Faith in Action program, a true community benefit organization.

Additional periodic youth volunteers from SVC Service Learning, Valley Youth Network, churches, and scout troops totaling 300+ in 2021. Covid impacted the availability of some groups and how some of the projects were completed.
