#### **Services Provided**

Laurel Area Faith in Action addresses the issues of isolation, loneliness, and basic needs. Working with local churches, schools, businesses, organizations, agencies, and individuals, Laurel Area Faith in Action connects volunteers with program recipients. Volunteers provide care and compassion to recipients through a variety of services. The way some services are delivered has been changed to meet CDC safety protocols. The intent of the program is to complement existing community services, not replace or compete with them.

Caring Volunteers are trained to assist elderly individuals with the following:

- **Appointment Escort** a friendly support person to meet the recipient at doctor appointments or go with them
- Correspondence help with paying bills, writing letters, and completing forms
- **Errands** groceries, toiletries, etc.
- Handyman/Yard work minor repairs, installations, and yard work, as needed
- **Referral Services** link to other services in the community
- **Technology Mentor** help with electronic devices
- **Telephone Reassurance** monthly calls to reduce isolation and remain connected
- **Transportation** rides to the store, doctor, medical tests, etc.
- Miscellaneous service requests taken on a case-by-case basis

#### Prospective Care Recipients requesting services qualify as follows:

- Live in Latrobe, Unity Township, Derry, Derry Township, Ligonier and Ligonier Township areas AND
- Aged 60 years and older AND
- Request services offered by the Program AND
- Complete and sign an application for services.

Care Recipients can expect to receive an average of up to 2 hours of service a week. All services are provided FREE of charge.



#### **Summary of Program Services**

#### **Provide Services to Meet the Needs of our Community**

Laurel Area Faith in Action currently has approximately 323 recipients and approximately 375 volunteers counting long-term as well as episodic volunteers. During 2023, there were more than 9,835 total volunteer hours provided during 4902 times of service. The impact of these numbers has a profound impact on the quality of life of our recipients.



#### **Volunteer Recruitment**

Laurel Area Faith in Action continues to seek partnerships with those in the communities we serve and are always seeking innovative ways to recruit volunteers. We share the mission and vision of Laurel Area Faith in Action at community events, churches, schools, businesses, in an effort to increase awareness of the various volunteer opportunities within Laurel Area Faith in Action. We are thankful for the amazing volunteers who continue to give of themselves to help others.



#### **Educational Opportunities**

The safety, health, and wellbeing of our volunteers and recipients is our highest priority. We provide education to help promote increased awareness about current events that could prove to put the overall welfare of the Faith in Action family in jeopardy. We have shared insights on nutrition, exercise, avoiding scammers, money management, and additional assistance resources.



#### **Strategic Planning**

We are planning for success in the years to come. The staff and board have been monitoring philanthropic trends and striving to stay on top of changes. 



• **Independence Health Care System** – Our partnership with Independence Health Care System continues as we both work toward the improved health and wellness of our community.



• Latrobe Area Hospital Charitable Foundation – Beginning in 2005, Laurel Area Faith in Action has received funding from this foundation. We are extremely appreciative of the continued support.



• Adelphoi Village – The collaboration with group homes at Adelphoi Village has been a tremendous success and this relationship has been a blessing to both Laurel Area Faith in Action as well as recipients. Supervised youth rake leaves for some elderly homeowners in our service area. Since the work began with Adelphoi in 2003, ten group homes have provided over 27,500 hours of service! We look forward to cultivating even stronger collaboration with Adelphoi in the future.



• Saint Vincent College – Since 2002, Laurel Area Faith in Action has collaborated with the college and students who help with household chores, yard work, friendly visits, as well as helping with socialization activities at area nursing homes and senior living facilities.



• Saint Vincent Basilica Parish – Laurel Area Faith in Action has enjoyed a long-standing connection with the members of the parish. The donation of the Grove event space for our annual Volunteer Appreciation Event is greatly appreciated. Many wonderful parishioners also volunteer their time, talents, and treasures to Laurel Area Faith in Action.



• Saint Vincent Seminary - Seminary students are enrolled in an ongoing practicum program with Laurel Area Faith in Action where they earn credit and gain pastoral experience. We are looking forward to the continuation of this program. Seminary students are paired with a recipient, and they meet on a weekly basis.



• Latrobe Presbyterian Church donates office space for staff and meeting space for Board and volunteer meetings. Staff and parishioners are extremely supportive of the work of Laurel Area Faith in Action.



• United Way of Southwestern Pennsylvania – Laurel Area Faith in Action has been blessed by the continued connection with The United Way of SWPa. Employees from local businesses participate through the United Way and directly with our Program to provide projects that directly help recipients remain living in their homes. We also receive an annual grant from The United Way. This year's grant was in the amount of \$20,000.00 to help with the day-to-day expenses of Laurel Area Faith in Action.



• Area Agency on Aging and Elder Abuse Task Force – Laurel Area Faith in Action works closely with the Area Agency on Aging to ensure the availability of services and information to our aging demographic. Our program serves on the countywide initiative to "reduce the number of victimized older adults through prevention, education, identification, and prosecution through a joint effort."



• Senior Employment Program (SEP), Westmoreland County Community College provides paid office staff who work on-site 16-20 hours per week. Laurel Faith in Action has been a training site since 2002.







• Unity Township Supervisors, Derry Township Supervisors, and City of Latrobe staff pick up hundreds of bags of raked leaves from recipients' homes and provide financial and other support.

#### **Funding**

Laurel Area Faith in Action continues to be blessed by the generosity of spirit and donations from many local organizations and individuals. Income reported in the Annual Report is based on a *cash basis* while the financial reports are based on an *accrual accounting basis*. The exact audited income appears on the current tax returns available at <a href="https://www.laurelfia.org">www.laurelfia.org</a> and will differ from this reporting due to the differences in accounting and reporting.

**Donors** – Laurel Area Faith in Action received 305 donations during 2023 totaling \$98,648.00, including grants. Even though we are very grateful for the generosity of our donors, this amount is below the amount necessary to meet our expenses. This deficit has been met by using some of our saved funds. However, this is not a long-term solution. Uncertain economic times and rising prices have had a negative impact on giving across the philanthropic spectrum. In order to overcome this monetary shortfall, Laurel Area Faith in Action is working diligently to broaden our donor base as well as increasing awareness to various giving opportunities. The ongoing generosity and support of the mission and vision of Laurel Faith in Action provides hope and promise that we will be able to continue to reach out into our community and continue to be a beacon of light to our aging neighbors.

#### **Fundraising Events and Projects**

- **Celebration of Community** "Run for the Rose's" was held in May. This event was not as successful as it has been in the past. We realized very little net profit after expenses were met. Laurel Area Faith in Action is looking for an alternative event to replace this celebration.
- Annual Appeal The annual appeal for 2023 brought in \$10,942.00 from 109 individuals with an average gift of \$100.38. The funds realized from the 2023 Annual Appeal amounted to only a little better than 50% of the amount received in 2022. Laurel Area Faith in Action relies on the funds from this appeal, and alternative fundraising options are being researched.



#### Remarkable return on investments!

Each year, the *Independent Sector*, a coalition of nonprofits, foundations, and corporate giving programs, calculates the Value of a Volunteer Hour. According to *The Non-Profit Times*, published April 19, 2023, the value of a volunteer hour jumped 6.2% reaching an estimated \$31.80 per hour in 2023. At this value per hour multiplied by the 9,835 volunteer hours for 2023, Laurel Faith in Action has a CBO (Community Benefit Organization) value of \$312,753. The total hours of volunteer service that has been provided by Laurel Area Faith in Action from the beginning of the program through the end of 2023 is an incredible 156,894.75 hours. Multiplying these numbers by the value of volunteer hour of \$31.80 places the aggregated dollar value at \$4,989,253.05! The staggering impact of these volunteer statistics is by far a significant contribution showing the amazing acts of kindness provided by the Laurel Area Faith in Action program a true community benefit organization.
