



HANDIBROKEN FANTOMS (LOL), is a mockumentary, dealing with the inclusion of people with disabilities in the film industry. It was self-produced and directed by herself with a motor disability (wheelchair) with reduced mobility, as part of an Avon 77 Kinorama. The director believes in humor and self-mockery to convey the positive messages about inclusion based on one's own disability situation, and lead to a co-construction. This short mockumentary is a potential game-changer for disabled people in these communities in France and elsewhere. HANDIBROKEN FANTOMS (LOL), reflects this state of mind by highlighting the "broken of life" which, alas, seems to become "invisible" or even "ghosts" in a modern society, claiming to be inclusive. A young actress presents herself to a casting for a spy role in an action film with stunts, despite her differences and her physical condition.



Director Biography - Rahma Sophia RACHDI


RACHDI is a trailblazing political journalist and changemaker, working from a wheelchair with fearless conviction. A former scientist holding a Ph.D. in Microbiology, she also earned an MBA, a Master's degree in Economics, and was awarded a prestigious fellowship in European Affairs from the ENA (École Nationale d'Administration).

For the past two decades, she has served as Chief Correspondent in Paris, covering the French Presidency and the Prime Minister's office for a major U.S. news agency — making her the first and only disabled journalist in that role for over 20 years. She also sits on the Board of Directors of the French Press Club, where she continues to advocate for media inclusivity.







Samuel Massilia is a director, screenwriter, producer (El Sueno Films), journalist, and former columnist and radio host. He began his career young, working on shows about Olympique de Marseille. At 15, he was a columnist and community manager for Club Foot Marseille on France Bleu Provence, then became assistant director and trainee editor at OMTV. In 2018, he joined Mon OM à Moi on Radio Star, which reached a record 4 million listeners in its final season.

Passionate about people's stories, he created his own website and has published over 500 interviews with artists in film, theater, music, and comedy. Known for his deep interest in human nature, he dedicated his first book, Authentique (published in 2022), to his friend and mentor René Malleville.

His first short film, Le Soleil, was written, directed, and produced with the support of the city of Aixen-Provence. It has been screened in retirement homes, middle and high schools, selected in Madrid and Stockholm, and even presented at the French National Assembly. In 2026, Samuel will release his second book, a novel co-written with actress and screenwriter Mylène Jampanoi.


INVISIBLE FRACTURES

One night, under the influence of drugs, he commits an irreparable act of violence against his parents. His younger sister Léa becomes the victim of brutal harassment at school. While Léa sinks into despair, Dylan finds a glimmer of hope within himself: to rebuild his life, protect his sister, and attempt to mend the pieces of a fractured family. Invisible Fractures explores the crushing weight of family expectations, the search for identity, and the resilience required to overcome devastating trials.

Director Biography - Jean-Michel Delphin LOUTOBY

JJean-Michel Loutoby is a Martinican screenwriter and director known for a cinematic approach rooted in social and human reality. Passionate about image and storytelling, he uses cinema as a tool for reflection and emancipation, exploring themes like identity, family transmission, and resilience.

From his early projects, he embraced engaged cinema where fiction reflects real societal issues. Drawing inspiration from the world around him, he aims to capture generational tensions and imposed life choices with authenticity. His immersive process includes meeting young people in difficulty, social workers, and families, giving voice to those rarely heard and creating emotionally resonant characters.



Kólá Túbòsún is a Nigerian writer and linguist, Fulbright scholar, Chevening Research Fellow, and author of poetry and a dictionary of names. He is the publisher of OlongoAfrica.com, co-editor of Best Literary Translations, and winner of the Special Prize of Premio Ostana (2016). This is his first film project.

Director's Statement:

History isn't always found in books—it lives in places, stories, and memories. Ebrohimie Road is my first film and a passion project about documenting and retrieving history. It reflects my ongoing interest in memory and archiving, shaped by my work in linguistics and literature. The film explores how one man's story became part of a national narrative, and how ecological changes affect our ability to remember. It offers a unique, intimate view of Africa's first Nobel Prizewinner, before he became a global figure—through a place that held part of his story.


Director Biography - Onke Meje

"I AM BECAUSE WE ARE" The Baobab Tree Story is a spiritually evocative short film that bridges African ancestral wisdom with modern-day consciousness. Through poetic narration and symbolic imagery, the film brings to life the teachings of the Baobab tree — often called the "Tree of Life" — as a guiding force for unity, resilience, and ecological harmony.

Inspired by the philosophy of Ubuntu — "I am because we are" — the film calls viewers to return to their roots, restore their relationship with the Earth, and honor the ancestral connections that continue to shape our collective destiny.

This short story is a sacred excerpt from the award-winning feature-length documentary The Spirit of Ubuntu, filmed across 10 African countries. The full documentary highlights powerful grassroots efforts, changemakers, and organizations that embody Ubuntu in action — from tree planting and food sovereignty to youth empowerment and interfaith healing. Together, these works weave a narrative of global transformation led by compassion, collaboration, and community.



In a time of global crises—wars, climate change, and ecological collapse—it is urgent to learn from Indigenous groups who have lived in harmony with nature for millennia. Among the few still living in tropical forests, the Baka are one of the oldest, having inhabited Africa's Congo Basin for over 50,000 years. No other group matches their knowledge of the forest, its animals, plants, and fragile ecological balance.

This film reveals, for the first time, the Baka's way of life and ecological and medical knowledge through drones and advanced filming techniques, within a broader historical, sociological, anthropological, and biological context. It results from a unique collaboration between the Baka, Cameroonian Bantu filmmakers, NGOs, environmental agencies, and university professors in the U.S. and Canada. This kind of cultural and multidisciplinary connection is more essential than ever—we must respect, engage with, and learn from those who understand Earth's ecosystems best.

Director Biography - Rui Diogo, Denis Ndeloh, Muleng Timngun


Rui Diogo, a multi-awarded researcher, speaker, and writer, is known for addressing major scientific and societal challenges. He has published 20 books and over 160 papers in leading scientific journals. His research on human evolution has received global media attention, with over 600 features in more than 50 countries, including BBC, CNN, and The New York Times.

He has appeared in TV interviews, documentaries, TED talks, and radio shows, collaborating with international media. His fieldwork spans remote regions of Africa and Asia, with travels to around 150 countries. Committed to challenging norms and promoting inclusivity, he has influenced global conversations on evolution and diversity through works like Evolution Driven by Organismal Behavior, Meaning of Life, Human Nature and Delusions, and Darwin's Racism, Sexism and Idolization.

Take Me to Fendika illuminates the traditional and innovative musical culture of Ethiopia at what has been called "the best venue in Africa." Run by world-renowned dancer, Melaku Belay, Fendika Cultural Center is a dynamic art space that draws artists from across Africa and the world to present music, dance, poetry, and visual art. This film tells the story of how this vital space came into being and how it continues to serve as a place for artists to invent and reinvent Ethiopian modernity and place it in dialogue with global culture.



Director Biography - Cisco Bradley

Cisco Bradley is a director, author, and professor at the Pratt Institute, where he teaches the history and aesthetics of music from the African diaspora and runs the Music and Migration Lab. He has founded three multimedia organizations that work to shed light on musicians operating in this sphere: New Revolution Films, www.jazzrightnow.com, and the Free Jazz Oral History Director Statement: This film was a collaboration between American, Ethiopian, and Ethiopian diaspora filmmakers and artists. We had a collective goal of portraying Melaku Belay and other artists featured in the film through their own words and narratives. The film has no "expert talking heads" and presents the dancers and musicians in the film as experts of their own work. We aimed for decolonial narratives of art, music, and creativity showcasing the Ethiopian genius manifest in both tradition and in contemporary innovation.


Director Biography - pietro cremona

Through his videos, he tells the stories of companies and individuals — and from this passion came the idea to tell the story of an entire people. **Director Statement:** The documentary received the patronage of the General Embassy of Burkina Faso. With Ablo by my side, I spent my time gathering stories — glimpses of their lives and the secrets of their culture. The people in this documentary were not given any direction; they simply spoke about their art, their roles in Burkinabè society, and their lives — freely and in their own words.

"The Journey East" is a feature-length documentary that traces the untold story of the Bashi people of South Kivu, whose deep-rooted heritage has too often been overshadowed. Guided by a singular narrator's voice, the film unfolds their origins, the rise and fall of their kingdom under colonial rule, and the seismic shifts—modernization, conflict, and famine—that shape their lives today. Conceived and directed by Michael Sayinet and produced by Visual Error between 2022 and 2024, production spanned Kinshasa, Walungu, Kabare, Bukavu, and Kalehe. After a test screening in Kinshasa in December 2023 and a soft premiere in August 2024, the film was finalized in January 2025. Intended for audiences drawn to history, culture, and the human consequences of colonialism and war, "The Journey East" offers an immersive portrait of resilience and identity in the heart of the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Director Biography - Michael Sayinet Mantchombe

Michael Sayinet is a Congolese filmmaker whose passion for storytelling has been shaped by both tradition and personal discovery. Born in August 1998, he traces his cinematic inspiration back to his mentor Mweze Ngangura, the celebrated director of La Vie Est Belle (starring the late Papa Wemba). In 2021...Director Statement: The documentary The Journey East was born from a deep desire to honor my people, the Bashi —past and present. I set out to illuminate their rich history and shed light on the challenges they face today. More than just a film, it is an invitation to rediscover the Democratic Republic of Congo through our own eyes, not filtered by outsiders. My hope is that The Journey East sparks curiosity among cinephiles and inspires more storytellers to capture the true soul of the DRC: its vibrant cultures, its enduring spirit, and its complex humanity. Too often, our nation is reduced to a single narrative of hardship; this film strives to replace that narrow view with stories of resilience, heritage, and hope. Ultimately, I want audiences everywhere to see the DRC not as a backdrop of poverty, but as a tapestry of histories waiting to be told.




Director Biography - Ambroise Prince



Director Statement: I made this film to shine a spotlight on the rich and vibrant Oromo culture and values, presenting them to a global audience through high-quality storytelling that bridges tradition and innovation. At its heart, the film is a powerful celebration of persistence, illustrating how unwavering determination can overcome even the strongest opposition. 

Director Biography - Pierre Aragou

Director Statement: It's a subject that is currently poorly covered and/or skimmed over, or even taboo. In fact, the media don't give it much coverage. Often

it's all about the consequences and very little about the causes. Statistical data showing

figures for police suicides in France, for example, are still very high and have been for over 25 years.

The police commit 45 suicides a year, or 41% more than the French working population... almost 1 suicide a week... It's staggering, but hardly anyone talks about it... or if they do, it's often negative and sensational. My personal journey began with reportage photography, then fashion photography, and ended in film.
