WILSON FACTS

CLIMATE

Wilson has a mild climate which is a favorable factor in the life of Wilson. On average, the temperature is in the 60's. During the summer you can enjoy a comfortable evening outside and during the winter there is very little snow. Wilson's elevation is 147 feet and averages four inches of rainfall per month.

POPULATION

Wilson was named after the prominent 19th century Eastern North Carolina Legislator, Col. Louis D. Wilson. The City of Wilson has a population of approximately 50,000 people. Wilson is the county seat, with a population of approximately 80,000 and a total area covering 374 square miles.

HOW TO GET TO WILSON

Wilson is conveniently located halfway between New York and Florida on I-95. You can take exits 107-121 to Wilson. Wilson is 45 miles east of Raleigh, the state capital, and 100 miles from the coast. Wilson is located 30 miles north of I40 and is intersected by US 301, US 264 (I-587), US 117 and I-795.

SEE THE WHIRLIGIGS!

The Vollis Simpson Whirligig Park is a two-acre park in Historic Downtown Wilson. It is home to thirty large whirligigs by celebrated folk artist Vollis Simpson. These kinetic sculptures are North Carolina's Official Folk Art. The park is your chance to see the largest number of sculptures, collected in one location, as well as many of the biggest Mr. Simpson created. Visitors can marvel at these unique artworks, some of which soar as high as sixty feet and weigh as much as 13,500 lbs.

The park also features a stage and greenspace for concerts, performances, films, and private events. A large pavilion on the site is home to many markets and events. Across the street, the museum features a gift shop, displays of smaller whirligigs, facts about Vollis Simpson, and information on the ongoing conservation work done to protect his important artistic legacy. The whirligigs are owned and maintained by a nonprofit organization which is dedicated to preserving them and to creating programming and education around them.



Vollis Simpson Whirligig Park & Museum

The new two-acre public sculpture park in Historic Downtown Wilson has been developed and constructed for the permanent conservation and enjoyment of the whirligigs created by folk artist Vollis Simpson, a native of Wilson County.

The Whirligig Park is a catalyst for cultural economic development for Eastern NC. The park is a major destination for cultural travelers worldwide and a unique gathering place offering greenspace for Wilson. The Vollis Simpson Whirligig Museum is adjacent to the park inside the Whirligig Station and Museum apartment building.

Freeman Roundhouse Museum

The Oliver Nestus Freeman Roundhouse is a museum featuring artifacts that depict the culture and contributions of African Americans to the history and development of Wilson County. The house was built in 1946 by Freeman who was a noted local black stone mason. The house is actually built of whatever Freeman could get his hands on including: bottles, tree saplings and string.

NC Museum of the Coastal Plain

The North Carolina Museum of the Coastal Plain is a regional museum that is dedicated to interpreting the ecology, pre-history, history, and culture of fourteen counties in the middle Coastal Plain through exhibits, collections of significant and appropriate artifacts, and programming for people of all ages. The museum is located on the third floor of the former Federal Post Office and Courthouse (224 East Nash Street), a four-story Beaux Art style building constructed in 1927. Visitors can tour both museums, Imagination Station Science & History Museum and the NC Museum of the Coastal Plain.

North Carolina Baseball Museum

Located at Historic Fleming Stadium at 300 Stadium Street, the museum has over 3328 square feet. The museums' 32 showcases and 18 wall displays feature baseball memorabilia of many aspects from across North Carolina. Memorabilia is from ball players born in North Carolina like: Catfish Hunter, Hoyt Wilhelm, Luke Appling, Gaylord Perry, Enos Slaughter, Rick Ferrell, and Buck Leonard. Players that have played at Fleming Stadium include: Ted Williams Carl Yastrzemski and Robin Roberts (all members of Baseball Hall of Fame.) It features a "Walk of Fame" area which has brick pavers to show North Carolina Baseball Museum memory, honor and recognition.

Imagination Station Science & History Museum

Located in Historic Downtown Wilson, this museum features interactive exhibits that are fun for all ages. On display are "Science On a Sphere", a room sized global system that uses computers and video projectors to display planetary data onto a six-foot diameter sphere, analogous to a giant animated globe and a new climbing wall exhibit.

Do you have Pre-K kids in your family? Enjoy our new "Curiosity Corner." This room is designed as a cozy atmosphere for the little ones to explore x-rays, nature, movement and more! 

J. BURT GILLETTE ATHLETIC COMPLEX

The complex has four youth baseball fields with 200 foot fences. All four fields have lights for night games, scoreboards, bullpens and covered dugouts are at field level. The complex has outdoor batting cages for practices or warm-ups. The feature field is the Southern Bank Stadium which is a small replica of another stadium in Wilson that was built in 1936 called Fleming Stadium. The stadium holds 600 spectators in the Grand Stand and 500 spectators in the outfield grass berm. The stadium has played host to the NC Little League State Championship and the City Little League Championships. The soccer complex encompasses 113 acres of land featuring 8 regulation size soccer fields, including two turf fields. Musco lighting provides the opportunity for exciting night play, and meets NCAA specifications.

The Wilson Tobs Baseball Club is a top level collegiate summer baseball team that competes in the Coastal Plains League, playing 30 home games at Historic Fleming Stadium. The team recruits college draft prospects from all over the nation. The Tobs bring exciting promotions, affordable concessions, and a "fun for all" atmosphere to the Wilson community.

The Tobs have been playing baseball since 1939 known then as the "Tobacconists." Fleming Stadium seats approximately 4,000 fans in a roofed grandstand. The stadium received a complete renovation in 1997 and is now one of the finest ballparks in eastern North Carolina. The North Carolina Baseball Museum is located at Historic Fleming Stadium. The season starts late May to early August. General Admission and Box Seating are available. Children under five get in free.





EDNA BOYKIN CULTURAL CENTER

In honor of Edna Boykin's lifetime contribution and service to the Arts in Wilson, the Edna Boykin Cultural Center opened its doors in January 1998. In the lobby, the first visual arts gallery exhibits were shown in the Hammond Gallery, named by Dr. & Mrs. Mark G. Hooper in honor of Dr. Robert Hammond. On the new theater's first opening night, January 31, 1998, Ms. Edna Boykin and Mrs. Eleanor Hammond were among the many in attendance to celebrate this wonderful updated theater with performances by The Dorsey Brothers Orchestra and The Platters.

The Center opened its doors in 1998 and offers a wide range of performances throughout the year. The renovation of this 1919 Vaudeville Theater, now with plush seating for over 600, provides the community with a breathtaking venue for the annual Boykin Series. Performances include an exciting lineup of theatre, comedy, music and more. The Edna Boykin Cultural Center is also home to the Arts Council Troupe for Youth, or ACT! ACT presents three performances annually, showcasing the area's youth talent. The Center houses the G.R. Hammond Gallery in the front of the theater which is open during performances and at other times by appointment.

THE KENNEDY THEATRE AT BARTON COLLEGE



PRESERVATION OF WILSON

Take a stroll through the Old Wilson Mile - an area near Barton College that tells the Wilson story with its rich heritage and unique architecture. The Mile is part of the Old Wilson Historic District listed on the National Register of Historic Places dating from the 1850's through the 1920's.

You will see notable architectural styles such as Gothic Revival, Italianate, Victorian Cottages, Queen Anne, Colonial Revival and Wilson's famous Bungalows. The Mile is marked with directional bronze medallions placed in the sidewalk to keep you on track. Preservation of Wilson is a nonprofit corporation that provides leadership in the revitalization efforts of Wilson County's unique architectural properties.







A RICH HISTORY

The village of Wilson, North Carolina was incorporated in 1849. Wilson was named for Mexican War hero, Gen. Louis Dickens Wilson, who had died during the war. The town had originally been two separate villages. One was Toisnot, located around the train depot. The other was Hickory Grove, near Toisnot Primitive Baptist Church. The church was founded in 1756 and moved to the Tarboro Street site in 1802.

Native Americans lived in what is now Wilson County for generations. The Tuscarora Indians lived here in the 16th, 17th, and early 18th centuries and left in 1713 after the great battle of Fort Nooherooka, just south of Stantonsburg in Greene County. The first recorded contact with a European was John Lawson, the explorer who came through the area in 1700 -1701. The local Indian village was named Tosneoc (meaning "tarry not" or "halting place"). The word is still used today with Toisnot Swamp, Toisnot Township, Toisnot Middle School, and Toisnot as the old name for Wilson and Elm City.







People began moving into the area with John Thomas in 1741, Francis Rountree in the early 1740's, Arthur Dew in 1749, Benjamin Boykin in 1752, and brother John and Capt. Jacob Barnes in 1761 and 1762. Africans also came early, the first recorded with John Thomas in 1741.

There was not much fighting in the county during the Civil War in the 1860s, but many soldiers came from Wilson County families. A Confederate hospital was created at the Wilson Collegiate Institute and the railroad transferred many soldiers toward the North or South.

Wilson was known for its fine educational institutions, central location, and accessible roads. The establishment of the tobacco market in 1890 gave the title of "The World's Largest Tobacco Market." The Civil War brought hard times for the county and the economic situation did not improve until the coming of the "golden leaf". Tobacco brought money, employment, new residential areas, new businesses, hotels and industry.


