CHAPTER 6

6 Then I saw when the Lamb opened one of the seven seals, and I heard one of the four living creatures say with a voice like thunder, "Come!" ²I looked, and behold, there was a white horse. The one riding on it had a bow, and a crown was given to him. He went out as a conqueror so he might conquer.

³When the Lamb opened the second seal, I heard the second living creature saying, "Come!" ⁴Then another horse came out, fiery red. The one riding on it was permitted to take peace from the earth, so that people would slaughter one another. He was given a great sword.

⁵ When the Lamb opened the third seal, I heard the third living creature saying, "Come!" And behold, I saw a black horse. The one riding on it held a balance scale in his hand. ⁶ Then I heard something like a voice in the midst of the four living creatures saying, "A quart of wheat for a denarius, and three quarts of barley for a denarius—but do no harm to the oil and wine!"

⁷ When the Lamb opened the fourth seal, I heard the fourth living creature saying, "Come!" ⁸ Behold, I saw a horse, pale greenish gray. The name of the one riding on it was Death, and Sheol was following with him. Authority was given to them over a fourth of the earth, to kill by the sword and by famine and by plague and by the wild beasts of the earth.

⁹ When the Lamb opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those slaughtered for the sake of the word of God and for the witness they had. ¹⁰ And they cried out with a loud voice, saying, "O Sovereign Master, holy and true, how long before You judge those who dwell on the earth and avenge our blood?"

¹¹ Then a white robe was given to each of them, and they were told to rest a little while longer, until the number of their fellow servants was complete—their brothers and sisters who were to be killed as they had been.

¹² I saw when the Lamb opened the sixth seal, and there was a great earthquake. The sun became as black as

sackcloth made of goat's hair, and the full moon became like blood. ¹³ The stars of heaven fell to the earth like a fig tree drops unripe figs when shaken by a great wind. ¹⁴ The heaven ripped apart like a scroll being rolled up, and every mountain and island was moved from their places.

¹⁵ Then the kings of the earth and the great men and the military commanders and the rich and the mighty and everyone—slave and free—hid themselves in the caves and among the rocks of the mountains. ¹⁶ And they tell the mountains and the rocks, "Fall on us, and hide us from the face of the One seated on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb. ¹⁷ For the great day of their wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"

(Revelation 6:1-17 TLV)

Insights

The Lamb opens each seal, and as He does, each of the four living creatures calls out his horseman to judge the earth. Soon after the inception of the church, the horsemen incite nature and humankind. The great tribulation, the first resurrection, and the ascension immediately precede His wrath (in 6:12-17). Seals are for signs and judgments but are not His wrath. At **the sixth seal**, He takes us up, and seven bowls of wrath are poured out. (16:2)

The Lamb opens **the first seal**. Its beast is a lion with six wings and circumspect vision, calling to a rider on a white horse who is focused on conquering. The disciples asked for the signs of His coming at the end of the age,

⁴ And Jesus answered and said unto them Take heed that no man deceive you ⁵ For many shall come in my name saying I am Christ and shall deceive many (Mat. 24:4-5) [The ancient Greek was not punctuated.]

After the resurrection, the war in heaven ended. The dragon and his angels were hurled to earth in chapter 12. Not long after that, a church empire rose, but its invisible king institutionalized idolatry. When the leaders gave up the good fight of faith, they subjected their followers to the enemy. The result was an entirely different "gospel." The apostasy forced its conversions by the spirit of antichrist. Many bishops claimed the place of Christ yet killed their opponents. Like the rider on the white horse, they appeared righteous but were deceivers, professing equality with Jesus Christ while misleading the church to conquer the world.

Yeshua's Kingdom is true, and He is its sole Foundation; no one is comparable to Him. He gives us crowns who overcome deceiving spirits by faith in the Word of God alone:

 33 These things I have spoken unto you, that in me you might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world. (Jn. 16:33)

 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. (Jn. $10{:}10\,{\rm ESV})-{\rm Yeshua}$

The Lamb breaks the **second seal**. The second beast, an ox with six wings and eyes all around, calls the *fiery red* horse and its rider to *take peace from the earth, and that they should kill one another: and there was given unto him a great sword. (6:4):*

⁹ And when you hear of wars and chaos, do not be terrorized; for <u>these things need to happen first</u>, but the end will not come at once."

¹⁰ Then He continued telling them, "Nation will rise up against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. (Lk. 21:9-10 TLV) – Yeshua

At the **third seal**, the living creature with a face like a man and six wings and eyes all around calls to the rider on the black horse, rationing, limiting sustenance, and regulating prices. The Lord commands the horseman: *A measure of wheat for a penny, and three measures of barley for a penny; and see thou hurt not the oil and wine. (6:6)* The oil and wine are especially precious. To believers they are like our Healer and Comforter.

¹¹ And great earthquakes shall be in divers places, and <u>famines</u>, and <u>pestilences</u>; and fearful sights and great signs shall there be from heaven. (Lk. 21:11) – Yeshua

By faith in Jesus, who is alive from the dead, we accomplish the impossible and prove the Word true. He's our Provider:

¹⁴ He causeth the grass to grow for the cattle and herb for the service of man: that he may bring forth food out of the earth; ¹⁵ and wine that maketh glad the heart of man,

and oil to make his face shine, and bread which streng-theneth man's heart. (Ps. 104:14-15) - Yeshua

The Lamb opens the **fourth seal**. Its living creature, an eagle with six wings and eyes all around, sends a horseman to judge the earth like the two before him, but this one rides a greenish-gray horse, the color of Death. Its place follows him as Sheol:

 22 And except those days be shortened, there should no flesh be saved: but for the elect's sake, those days shall be shortened. (Mat. 24:22) – Yeshua

Believers have overcome famine, genocide, plague, war, persecution, and disaster. The horsemen are in the news, reminding us that He stands at the door and knocks for us to open to Him.

As He opens **the fifth seal**, Yeshua hears the prayers of the martyrs under the altar who long for God to judge the killers of His holy ones. They're not vengeful, but long for righteousness to prove justice against those with hands full of blood; He hasn't done that yet. *Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, and shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake. (Mat. 24:9)* Chapter 13 fits as the fifth seal until Jesus comes on a cloud for the elect (in Mat. 24:29-31; 1 Thes. 4:16-17)

Martyrs under the altar are told to rest till the persecution of others who'd die as they had is complete. *Immediately after the tribulation,* at the **sixth seal,** Christ comes in a cloud as men hide from His wrath. (Mk. 13:24-27) The sun is black; the moon is red; the heavens shake. Yeshua shouts to raise martyrs to life; His archangel calls out; a great trumpet blasts, and survivors are caught up together with the elect to join Him above, but Israel grieves for her Son. It isn't secret; Jesus described it long ago:

²⁹ Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken: ³⁰ And then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. ³¹ And he shall send his angels with a great sound of a trumpet, and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other. (Mat. 24:29-31; cf. Rev. 6:12-17; 1 Thes. 4:13-18)
