Preface

I never chose to write, but God chose me to write what He would teach me. It began when He commanded me to write a book in 2003. Soon after publishing it in late 2009, He spoke to me in His silent voice in 2010 and led me to find the truth of His words. Probably the reason He chose me was that I was the least likely person for the job; but He had spoken, so I pressed in to find the truth and believe it. His Spirit was my Revelator as I wrote *The Union; Mysteries of the Ancient Word* came out of it, and from the mysteries, to my surprise, the prophecies opened!

When I saw Revelation in Daniel, I studied them together to understand Daniel 7. I was mixing the verses, cross-referencing and connecting them; it was confusing, especially for the reader.

To simplify the text, I extracted Revelation, setting its verses apart from Daniel, not yet knowing God was leading me to write another book. Soon I realized He was revealing the Revelation. When I got into its prophetic words, in moments, I saw the order of events and wondered how we'd missed them all these years!

He revealed the prophecies and their mysteries to me though I had never before understood them. Like scattered pieces of a puzzle, they neatly fit into their places in history, which He also revealed. I saw its picture after the Spirit guided me one step at a time by revelation. My greatest challenge was to explain it all.

I researched history as His Spirit impressed me and searched the Bible to confirm my findings, and vice-versa. I leaned on the Holy Spirit for wisdom to take me through the details. The metaphors opened before I found the evidence that confirmed them. History took my breath away! Of course, it was the work of God; there was no other way to do it than by His Holy Spirit.

Mysteries of the Ancient Word took a turn as the mysteries without prophecies. More things came to light as I meditated and prayed for the keys of Daniel 7 to unlock *The Revelation of Jesus Christ*.

The Message

His Word is universally and eternally understood by its Author the Holy Spirit who opens our understanding if we look to the Master as our Teacher. I depend on the anointing and mantle God has given me, and He faithfully reveals the answers to my many questions. The point is, it doesn't take a genius to

understand the words of God; it just takes the love of the truth and the faith of a child. He penned His words by ordinary men, often in humble circumstances.

Now that we have professed our faith and love for Him, we must prepare for the renewal of our minds. Believing the Word is like eating the whole lamb at the first Passover in Egypt—guts, brains, and all! Now it's time to eat and digest the parts that are hard to swallow. (See Ex. 12:5-9)

The apostle Paul urged us to demolish strongholds and everything that exalts itself above the Word of God. He too had learned the deceptions, so he went to the desert to get rid of them and learn the truth. We discover the arguments in our own flesh. Like Paul, we were taught the strongholds, but God has given us boldness to believe Him, not the traditions and teachings of men:

⁴ For the weapons of our warfare are not fleshly but powerful through God for the tearing down of strongholds. We are tearing down false arguments ⁵ and every high-minded thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God. We are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Messiah— (2 Cor. 10:4-5 TLV)

²⁷ But the anointing which ye have received of him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in him. (1 Jn. 2:27)

I'm hopeful all of us who love the Lord Jesus Christ will obey Him and unite by our love for the truth of the Word of God.

Preface

Unveiled! has two objectives: to understand the prophecies, and to share their truth with clarity. I'm hoping our opinions will change as we take down the strongholds that affect our faith when what we think we know contradicts the Scriptures.

The revelations are progressive; therefore, the deep passages are easier to understand by reading this book from its beginning because Daniel has important keys that unlock many of them. The material is difficult to explain, so I repeat some things when they are relevant in other places. Please don't run ahead of the order, or its words will confuse you. Try to avoid holding onto what you think you know; the prophecies require the renewal of our minds. If your thoughts are challenged, command your heart to believe God alone—you'll find His every word is true.

The two parts of this book interact, covering different epochs of history. The second part includes details of the first part's prophecies, and the first part sheds light on the second. After reading *Unveiled!* from start to finish, turn back and forth from one part to the other for greater clarity.

This has been a prayerful endeavor. At times, I've implored the Spirit to reveal things, pressing into Him for His wisdom and truth. He has answered me, so I've trusted Him for the rest.

As we believe in Jesus Christ for salvation, the Bible *rings* true and is *proven* true because it *is* true; however, if we rely on intellectual opinions, we stop believing God. He doesn't care for vanities. If we search the Bible without expecting answers, we should question whether we want to find the answers at all. That's why we're *ever learning but never able to come to the knowledge of the truth. (2 Tim. 3:7) But I am tenacious.*

Since 2010, I've written three books on the Word but was not a writer when I began and had no intention to write anything. The second and third book each came out of the one before it. In retrospect, that made sense since they were progressive in depth though I had not known that would be the case when I started.

The Holy Spirit motivates me, putting His thoughts in my mind and heart as He guides me, correcting my errors. I can do nothing well without His help and counsel. He rarely gets the credit, but no one does anything apart from His gifting. *In Him we live, and move, and have our being.* (Acts 17:28; also Heb. 1:3)

He prodded me to search out obscure words, so I believed

He would open them; then He enlightened me. When I found them in history, the details amazed me. I expected scriptural confirmations and got them. I studied concordances, but the Holy Spirit usually brought the words to mind. For the phrases, e.g., "the Great Sea," I turned to Biblegateway.com to find the frequency of the expressions and went to literal and interlinear translations for verification. I often checked Hebrew, Greek, and Aramaic dictionaries for the meanings of words.

I believe God literally unless He speaks symbolically, which He often does in prophecy. Then I "press in" to "see" the mental pictures, praying and meditating till I understand. In my lifetime, He had led me out of more confusing words than these, so I knew He could teach me His Logic [Logos/ "Word"] as I studied His prophecies and discovered their evidence in history.

About Prophecy

We must approach *The Revelation of Jesus Christ* from a spiritual perspective. Though its words are enigmatic, its title, *Apocalypse*, is derived from the Greek, *apokalipsis*, "to uncover, or reveal." *Unveiled!* sheds light on the connection of history to the writings that foretold our world and our future—writings that were meant to be unveiled for us to *see* at the end of the age.

I have quoted many scriptures to further confirm my statements. Having a Bible by your side will be helpful for the many parenthesized references. If you will, believe and receive the truth you find in these pages, and its words will prepare you for the future ahead of time. The prophetic picture is greater than we have imagined. It is past, present, and future, and it is stunning! The greatest war in the history of the world was prophesied.

² I will go before thee and make the crooked places straight: I will break in pieces the gates of brass, and cut in sunder the bars of iron: ³ And I will give thee the treasures of darkness, and hidden riches of secret places, that thou mayest know that I, the LORD, which call thee by thy name, am the God of Israel. Preface

After the keys in Daniel unlocked the Revelation, a lot of things became clear. When His Spirit unveiled Daniel 7, I knew the identity of the beast in Revelation 13 and later found many more details than at first glance. Their words include uncanny details of past events, and history was at my fingertips as I searched the internet.

By understanding the prophecies, I knew what to expect from history and found the events corroborated by a variety of sources. I also watched many history documentaries many more times than I care to admit.

In this deceived and darkened world, I hunger to know the truth until it fills me. My goal is to make these books more His than mine, and He is by my side, reminding me of that.

of God. ¹¹ For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. ¹² Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God. ¹³ And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual truths to those who are spiritual. (1 Cor. 2:10b-13 ESV) – the Spirit is the Teacher

In the Table of Contents, the Insights in Revelation are not listed; rather, the Revelation is indexed by the content of each chapter to help familiarize the reader with its events, which are without sequential order except the enumerated ones, e.g., "first vial, second vial; first trumpet, second trumpet," etc.

Depending on its context, "the church" refers either to the institutional churches or to the multitude who profess to believe, both of which include the true church though not exclusively. The true church includes all who have personally made the Jewish Messiah, Jesus Christ, their Savior and King. Till the end comes, not even the angels can decide between the wheat and the tares, grown together by the plantings of the devil; therefore, I haven't capitalized the "church," often making no distinction between the true church and those who profess the faith though holiness is required of all who confess Jesus' wonderful name.

Jesus' name in Hebrew is Yeshua, a shortened form of Yehoshua[h], His full Hebrew name. Another shortened form of the same name is Y'shua. His name is transliterated as Joshua. *Iesous* is its Greek counterpart, the second language of Rome's empire, commonly spoken in Galilee as was Aramaic.

Since we translate *Jesus* into Hebrew as *Yeshua*, throughout this text, *Yeshua* is used interchangeably with *Jesus*. [The letter "J" did not exist in any language prior to the 14th century and was uncommon in England until the 18th century. The first King James Version of 1611 called the Lord *Iesus*. d] In any language, His name indicates His place in the Father for His name is the Word of God. It's a mystery.

Occasional underlining emphasizes words relevant to the topic. Most of the Bible verses are indented in sans serif font, distinguishing them from Insights; some are *italicized* to enhance the reading experience and pragmatically, to conserve space.

The indented scriptures that are in italics are clarifications by the translators to help the reader. Concerning upper and lower cases: "the Scriptures" indicates the Holy Bible, but "scriptures" points to particular passages or verses.

The words "man" or "men" most often refer to mankind or to person(s) as a generic word. This is common in the Scriptures and is appropriate since in the beginning, woman was taken out of man; thus, we are all mankind and should not be offended. (See Gen. 2:21-23)

The substitution for the unspoken Hebrew name of God, [the tetragrammaton YHWH], in most biblical texts is "LORD." In the Tree of Life Version, it is *ADONAI*. Both have two sizes of font to indicate His holy name. The substitute for *Adonai* is "Lord" in most biblical texts. *Elohim* [plural] is rendered "God." *Adonai YHWH* is "Lord God." Some write "G-d" in respect of the Jews, but I've chosen "God" since He has not hidden Himself. Despite the efforts of the scribes, He has made His holy name famous: *my name shall be great among the Gentiles; and in every place incense shall be offered unto my name, and a pure offering: for my name shall be great among the heathen, saith the LORD of hosts. (From Mal. 1:11) Our prayers go up as incense to the LORD. (Rev. 5:8) Like incense, apart from the fire, prayers are impotent.*
