
PROJECT AED365 DONATION RECIPIENT

Can they accommodate special dietary needs? Do they have enrichment programs? Do they have in-house PCP, psychiatric, podiatry, vision, dental or other providers? Do they accept ALTCS?

The answer(s) - Yes.

YES, WE HAVE RESPITE ROOMS

Respite services are available at a daily rate and include medication management, meals, inhouse activities, enrichment programs, trained-certified caregivers. Keep in mind, it does take about 5 business days (depending on the responsiveness of the provider and pay source) to complete all of the paperwork, obtain any prescriptions, negative TB test (less than 12 months old), etc. So, if you are planning a summer vacation, contact us early for respite care so we can reserve a spot and take care of all the details. We are always happy to answer any questions you may have!
