

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE HAMLET OF KIRKMAN

The council of the Rural Municipality of Neipawa No. 487 in the province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw the expressions:
 - (a) "public highway" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by The Highways Act, but shall not include a provincial highway as designated in pursuance of such Act;
 - (b) "motor vehicle" shall have the meaning ascribed to it by The Vehicles Act.
2. (a) Subject to 2(b), no person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed than 50 kilometers per hour on a public highway within the hamlet of Kirkman;
- (b) No person shall operate a motor vehicle at a greater speed limit than 30 kilometers per hour on that portion of public highways within the hamlet of Kirkman, designated as playground zones and described as follows:
 - (i) On Alfred Street from the intersection of Tindal Avenue and Alfred Street to a point of 127 metres north of the said intersection;
 - (ii) On Tindal Avenue from the intersection of Alfred Street and Tindal Avenue to a point of 177 metres east of the said intersection.

3. Section 2 shall not apply to the operators of fire engines, and fire department apparatus and operators of an ambulance where these vehicles are being operated on emergency duty and employing the siren and flashing red lights.

4. Any person guilty of an infraction of the provisions of this Bylaw shall be liable to the penalties in the general penalty bylaw of the municipality.
