

BYLAW #2021.07

A BYLAW TO REGULATE ACTIVITIES AND THINGS IN OR ON MUNICIPAL ROADS

enacts as follows: The Council of the Rural Municipality of Nipawin No. 487, in the Province of Saskatchewan,

This Bylaw may be referred to as the Roads Bylaw

Definitions

- 2. In this Bylaw:
- a) "Council" means the Council of the Rural Municipality of Nipawin No. 487;
- b "Designated Officer" means an employee or agent of the Municipality appointed by Council to act as a municipal enforcement officer for the purposes of this Bylaw or, in the absence of a designation by the council, the Administrator;
- c) "Municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Nipawin No. 487;
- <u>a</u>) "emergency" means a situation in which there is imminent danger to public safety or of serious harm to property; and
- உ "municipal road" means a street or road under the direction, control and management of Council by virtue of section 12 of The Municipalities Act.
- $\dot{\omega}$ land that is part of the original road allowance or the subject of a registered road plan. For greater certainty, the term "municipal road" when used in this Bylaw includes any

Encumbering of Roads

- 4. rubbish, fences or other objects without the express permission of Council. No person shall place or leave on or within any municipal road any earth, stones
- S unsafe locations may be significantly cut back or removed completely. No person shall allow trees to overhang on any municipal road. Trees growing in

Excavations on Roads

9 No person shall make any excavations on or within any municipal road without the express permission of Council.

Permits

- 7. the safety, health or welfare of people or (ii) without damage to the municipal road or or leaving of any earth, stones, fences or other objects, or the making of any Notwithstanding sections 4 and 5 of this Bylaw, Council may, if satisfied that the placing other property, give permission to a person to do the same. excavations, on or within any municipal road, can be done (i) without compromising
- ∞ Any setbacks for trees, dugouts, fences or other objects shall be as per the Zoning

- **Dust Suppressant** 9. Persons may a subject to all costs being their responsibility. Persons may apply a dust suppressant such as calcium chloride on the municipal road
- 10. shall grade the road surface compromising the dust suppressant applied. Public safety and road security take precedence and, as such, the rural municipality



Enforcement of Bylaw

The administration and enforcement of this Bylaw is hereby delegated to the Designated Officer.

Order to Remedy Contravention

- 12. If a Designated Officer finds that a person has contravened sections 4, 5 and/or 6 of this contravention. Bylaw, the Designated Officer may, by written order, require the person to remedy the
- 13. The written order shall state:
- a) what is to be done to remedy the contravention;
- b) the time within which the person must comply with the direction; and
- \mathbb{C} that if the person does not comply with the direction within the time specified the Municipality may do what is required to be done at the expense of the

Service of Orders

Orders given under Bylaw shall be served in accordance with section 390 of The Municipalities Act.

Municipality Remedying Contravention

- In the event an order issued pursuant to section 12 of this Bylaw is not complied with within the time specified, the Municipality may take whatever actions or measures are necessary to remedy the contravention.
- In an emergency the Municipality may take whatever actions or measures are necessary to eliminate the emergency, in accordance with section 367 of The Municipalities Act.

Recovery of Unpaid Expenses and Costs

- Any expenses incurred by the Municipality in remedying a contravention of sections 4, 5 or 6 of this Bylaw may be recovered by civil action for debt in a court of competent jurisdiction.
- The Municipality may add any costs incurred in eliminating an emergency to the tax roll emergency is the assessed person, in accordance with section 369 of The Municipalities of any property in the Municipality in respect of which the person who caused the

Offences and Penalties

- 19. No person shall:
- fail to comply with an order made pursuant to this Bylaw:
- <u>b</u> obstruct or interfere with any Designated Officer or any other person acting under the authority of this Bylaw; or
- c) fail to comply with any other provision of this Bylaw
- 20. Every person who contravenes any provision of section 19 is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction:
- in the case of an individual, to a fine of not more than \$10,000;
- <u>b</u> in the case of a corporation, to a fine of not more than \$25,000; and
- $^{\circ}$ in the case of a continuing offence, to a maximum daily fine of not more than \$2,500 per day.





Repeal Previous Bylaws21. Bylaw 2020.07 is hereby repealed.

Coming into Force22. This Bylaw shall come into force on the day of its final passing.
