# **CTSGNA February Dinner Meeting**

ECHN is hosting the CT SGNA meeting on February 15, 2007 at Manchester Memorial Hospital. It will begin at 6PM with a light supper, followed by business meeting and networking. Dr. Peter Buch will be presenting Clinical Pearls, discussing Celiac Disease, Ischemic Colitis, and Barretts. One contact hour has been approved for this program. ECHN has two hospitals that provide GI services to Outpatients and Inpatients. Both Manchester Memorial Hospital and Rockville General Hospital provide care in collaborations with the physicians, the RN and the Endoscopy assistants to ensure the comfort and safety of patients during their procedure. We inform and educate our patients and their family members of what to expect before, during and after their procedures. We answer any questions that they may have, helping to make it a more comfortable experience for them. Using the nursing process, the qualified and caring staff of RNs, LPN and endoscopy assistants provide a safe environment for the patients. Our patients are monitored according to the SGNA and JCAHO standards of care. For our Outpatients we follow up with a telephone call the next day regarding their care and experience.

The GI center at the Manchester Memorial Hospital opened in March of 2003. There are twenty four pre and post procedural beds and seven procedure rooms. There are eight Gastroenterologists, five colorectal surgeons, one general surgeon and one APRN that schedule procedures. There are fifteen RNs, one LPN, and eight endoscopy assistants as wall as a per-diem staff of eight. We perform colonoscopies, endoscopies, enteroscopies, motility studies, capsule endoscopies and bronchoscopies in the GI center. ERCPs are performed in the radiology department. We also travel to the ICU and the OR for procedures. We average 45 cases a day. There is a RN and endoscopy assistant available twenty four hours a day, seven days a week for emergency cases.

The GI department at the Rockville General Hospital opened in February of 2004. There are two procedure rooms and four pre and post procedural rooms. There are six Gastroenterologists, three coco-rectal surgeons and one general surgeon that schedule procedures. The staff includes five RNs, two endoscopy assistants and four per diems. The procedures performed at the Rockville center are colonoscopies, endoscopies, enteroscopies, bronchoscopies, TEEs and as of September 2006 we have performed eighteen EUS procedures. ERCPs are performed in the Radiology department. The staff also travels to the ICU and the OR when needed. The department averages eighteen case a day. There is a RN available twenty four hours a day, seven days a week for emergency cases.
