

Excellence in Professionalism Distinction: This distinction recognizes nurses who have demonstrated commitment to excellence by validation of qualifications through certification.

Outstanding Certified Region: This award recognizes the SGNA Regional Society most active in supporting ABCGN certification.

<u>Certification Scholarship</u> The ABCGN Certification Scholarship provides financial assistance for the certification exam.

Fall Exam: Application Window: June 1 - July 31 at 11:59 pm Eastern Standard Time. Testing Window: October 1 - October 31, candidates will select their time and location through the Prometric website.

Spring Exam: Application Window: January 1 - February 28 at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time. Testing Window: May 1 - May 31, candidates will select the time and location through the <u>Prometric</u> webs

<u>Re-certification Scholarship:</u> The ABCGN Re-certification Scholarship provides financial assistance for recertification by contact hours. Applicants must apply the same year their recertification application is due.





In addition to multiple peer-reviewed publications and national poster presentations, she has also published multiple textbook chapters on IBD, served as Co-Editor on a textbook on Diarrhea, and contributed to The Netter Collection of Medical Illustrations on the digestive system. Dr. Vaziri is passionate about teaching and mentoring residents and fellows. She has been the recipient of the UConn School of Medicine GI Fellowship Program's Outstanding Teacher Award seven times since 2011.






Praneet Wander, MD


