2nd Autopsy on Houston Socialite Performed

HOUSTON (AP) — Dr. Milton Helpern, New York City medical examiner, said Saturday night that the results of a second autopsy performed Saturday on Mrs. Joan Robinson Hill, a socialite, will not be known for several days.

A team of 12 medical men were present for the seven hour autopsy. One autopsy had been performed shortly after Mrs. Hill's death on March 19 at Sharpstown General Hospital. She had been admitted to the hospital just 15 hours earlier.

After a death certificate was issued for acute viral hepatitis, two Harris County Grand juries probed circumstances surrounding her death, but neither rendered a statement.

Harris County Medical Examiner Dr. Joseph A. Jachimczyk led the team of medical men in exhuming her body Saturday following a request from District Atty. Carol S. Vance.

"Matters which have been brought to my attention," Vance said, "matters which have been presented before the Harris

County Grand Jury, and the professional medical opinion of (three) doctors" are the reasons for the exhumation and a second autopsy.

Dr. Helpern's participation was requested by Houston oilman Ash Robinson, father of the deceased.

Mrs. Hill's husband Dr. John

R. Hill, a Houston plastic surgeon, requested that four doctors be present at the autopsy.

Jachimczyk said that should any of the medical men who participated in the autopsy have a statement that disagrees with the official statement, the doctor or doctors would be allowed to release their opinions.
