#### **VFW Hometown Hero Banners**

Veterans of Foreign Wars Down River Post 7487 Cmdr. Paul J. Harrigan gave a presentation on the Hometown Heroes banners, with proposed placement, sizing and material suggestions to be added to the village.

Harrigan proposed 18x36 banners, either vinyl or an all-weather composite material. Superintendent Mang and the Trustees agreed that if a metal sign was to be used, that there needs to be a brace along the bottom of the edge to ensure it is stationary and not free-swinging.

Superintendent Mang recommended placement of banners on every other village light post on Center Street from 9<sup>th</sup> Street to 6<sup>th</sup> Street, every other pole between 4<sup>th</sup> Street and the river, every pole at the waterfront, and avoiding the section between 4th Street and 6<sup>th</sup> Street because they are already very congested. This would provide locations for approximately 50 banners.

The two-sided banners would be on display from Memorial Day through Veterans Day and placed on the sidewalk side of the poles. The Trustees asked for the VFW to return with sign samples to see what will work best. No action was taken.

## NEW Local Law #05-2024 – Revision to Sec. 20-50

**BUSINESS** Superintendent Mang spoke on the proposed law, requiring a sump pump to be installed in a home upon the sale of the property. Mang said we are overwhelming the sewer plant. This will benefit the village entirely, keep the treatment costs down and limit flooding.

## **Estimates for LSLI Identification**

Superintendent Mang said he has received a few estimates on the LSLI Identification requirements. We have budgeted for \$20,000 a year to supplement the costs and the estimates look to be under this. The hydro-excavation companies say they are able 17-20 services a day.
