Amazon Sidewalk: How To Opt Out & Why You Should. Amazon is planning on launching Amazon Sidewalk on its Echo devices. Sidewalk sets up a shared community Wi-Fi network. This means you and your neighbors will share each others WiFi. Some Amazon devices already have Sidewalk installed and it is turned ON by default. Users will need to opt-out of Sidewalk to not share their WiFi bandwidth with their neighbors.

Mesa Library - An important message about RBdigital audiobooks: OverDrive, the leading digital reading platform, recently acquired RBdigital. On October 29, 2020, our always-available RBdigital audiobooks were transferred to the Library's OverDrive service (aka the Greater Phoenix Digital Library) for use with the Overdrive app or Libby app. What does this mean for you? - **How to upgrade from an older Mac operating system to macOS Catalina or Big Sur.** Apple offers Migration Assistant both when setting up a Mac (whether new or erased) and as an app within macOS, particularly to migrate user accounts and applications. As a source, you can use a Time Machine backup, a disk image copy of your macOS startup volume (via a cloning app, for instance), or another Mac. But Migration Assistant has its limits: in Catalina and Big Sur, you must migrate from a backup made from or a computer running Mac OS X 10.11 El Capitan or later. Attempts to copy from older installations lead to an error. However, you're not stuck. [You have several alternatives you can try](#).

- **Microsoft really wants you to stop using Internet Explorer** Microsoft has taking further steps to kill off Internet Explorer in Windows 10 by removing support for Microsoft Teams. In August, Microsoft began laying out its plans for the end of life for Internet Explorer and how they plan on slowly removing support for the archaic browser. As part of this plan, Microsoft is no longer supporting Microsoft Teams in Internet Explorer as of November 30th, 2020. While users may be able to use the service, there will be no guarantees that it will work correctly. [Read the article here](#).
