- What to do if there is a fire

911 Emergency

Is it really an emergency?

- If someone is not breathing, always call 911
- **Call 911 for a fire**
 - Have the correct address
 - Talk clearly, answer all questions
 - Stay on the line
 - Give as much information as possible



Fall Prevention

- Exercise Daily
- Use Mobility Aids
- Check Medications
 - Take a list of all medications and supplements (vitamins, aspirin, etc to a pharmacist to check for interactions



Fall Prevention

- Ear and Eye Check
- Clean up Clutter
- Light it up!
- No Throw Rugs
- Shoe choice
 - Good fit, no flip flops, or floppy slippers



Smoke Alarms

Smoke alarms save lives!

- Have smoke alarms in your home
- Test them once a month
- Replace batteries once a year or sooner if they fail a test
- Smoke Alarm Program
 - Change batteries
 - Install 2 new detectors for free

Fire Safety

Should we try to put out a fire?
Blanket, extinguisher?

In the 70s, 15 mins to escape

- Now, how many minutes?
- What if you are sleeping?
- What if you need a mobility device?



Kitchen Safety

- Unattended cooking is the leading cause of house fires
- Stay by the stove
- Use oven mitts
- Take care with hot liquids and foods
- Keep kids and pets away from stove



Kitchen Safety

- Keep floors free of clutter
- Keep an eye on cords (coffee maker, electric knife, plate warmer)
- Know how to put out a grease fire (smother, do not use water)
 - If frying, make sure oil does not overheat, or spill out of fryer



Extension Cords

- Make sure they are not overloaded, will eventually fail
- Select the correct cord for the job
- Check for damage before use



Extension Cords

- Keep out of way as a tripping hazard
- Make sure cords aren't pinched or under rugs
- Use is temporary, store correctly



Fire Safety

- Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from combustibles
- Keep matches and lighters out of reach of children
- Never leave children alone with a lit candle (set an alarm if you light one)



Fire Safety

- Water Christmas trees, keep decorations away from candles/heaters
- Close all bedroom doors at night
- If you enjoy an outside fire, make sure it's extinguished (use water) before you leave it
