

WHO DO YOU TRUST TO ANSWER?

"Then you call on the name of your god, and I will call on the name of the Lord. The god who answers by fire—he is God." Then all the people said, What you say is good." (1 Kings 18:24)

As I read our study text for today, I found myself transported to the top of Mount Carmel, a place historians tell us was a fertile area with oak, olive, and fig trees. Here in this region, Elijah called for a national time of renewal -- a moment when Israel was convened so they could take time to look deep within their hearts and make a choice between the God of heaven and earth and Baal, the creation of a god made by earthly hands.

After asking the assembled multitude how long they were going to waver between God and Baal, a stunning silence was all Elijah could expect. There was a deadly silence broken only by the sound of the wind in the trees. It is at this point that Elijah proceeded by suggesting a showdown between the false prophets and himself. The specifics of Elijah's proposal were the following:

- 1. Two altars were to be built and wood laid on them. There was to be no hidden fire. If you are wondering why Elijah made this stipulation, it is because the prophets of Baal often built tunnels under their altars which would channel a gust of air to the altar. A slight flame could become a roaring inferno in seconds. One of Elijah's rules was, 'no fire.'
- 2. There were to be two bullocks or oxen. One for the prophets of Baal and one for Elijah, which were to be cut up and laid atop the wood on the altars.

Like me, you also may be wondering why Elijah specifically asked for bullocks. We find the answer in **Leviticus 16: 6, "And Aaron shall present the bull as the sin offering for himself and make atonement for himself and for his house."**

The bullock was a sin offering. It showed that the true in heart must be made right always with God in utter humility and complete contrition...it is the person humble in mind, broken in heart, contrite in spirit with whom God, by His Spirit, designs to come and dwell...(God) draws near to the one who senses his sin, seeks cleansing, and believes implicitly that he will come to abide.

None of this was true of the prophets of Baal. Despite all of the great deeds done on his behalf by God, (Elijah) still knew his own unworthiness. Then he prayed that his requests would be honored. My favorite line from the Bible is "God always honors those who honor Him."

- 3. The prophets of Baal would go first and call on their gods. Elijah would follow and call upon Jehovah.
- 4. The God who answered by fire would be declared "the God of all."

This is when we find that the silent mass found their voices again and responded with, 'what you say is good' which is just another way of telling Elijah to proceed as planned! I am sure the people agreed to the proposal, some from curiosity to see what would happen, others in the hope that Baal would gain the victory, but some, a few perhaps, from a real desire to be certain whether Jehovah was the true God.

The fact that a severe drought had impacted their lives for 3½ years, did not keep the people of Israel from questioning the validity of God's rulership. This reminded me of Jesus' words in the parable of the rich man and Lazarus where he observed, "If they do not hear and listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded and convinced and believe even if someone should rise from the dead.

We might ask what more did Israel need to prove God was in control?

The essence of the real question to be decided atop Carmel was simply this, for three years people realized that Baal had a massive case of impotence, but if Yahweh had given rain again, they would have blabbered about how Baal had recovered and rejuvenated. So before it was safe for Yahweh to send rain, Baal must be discredited -- clearly, publicly, and on national prime time. Hence the extreme measure. After Baal was exposed as a non-god, no one with a clear head can think the rain came from him.

Who is the real God? was the question that dominated. And, Who was the only God who could be trusted? Interestingly enough, if we review the Old Testament history of Israel, it was at Mount Sinai, where the God of heaven and earth, Jehovah, writing with His own finger on tablets of stone, wrote the words, - **You shall have no other gods before Me.** But now, we find Elijah, in making a stand for God on Mount Carmel, saying loud and clear, - There is no other God.

At Mount Carmel the Israelites were led from the purely practical confession WE HAVE ONLY ONE GOD to an absolute

recognition, THERE IS NO OTHER GOD.

Would an idol made by the hands of man answer the plea of the prophets of Baal? Or would the Creator, God of heaven and earth speak in an unquestionable way? This was not a question just for Israel. It is also a question that comes to each of us today for we all find ourselves facing a god called Baal, in some form or other. How often we fall prey to the temptations of this world and compromise with the ways of Baal!

Dear friends! As Oswald Chambers said, 'It is not our trust that keeps us, but the God in whom we trust who keeps us'. When I review my entire life, the question that came to my mind was, on what occasions have I found my God to be worthy of my trust? I found answer to my question in the following words written by someone unknown,

Trust is the bridge over the raging river. Trust is how we access God's way for us. Trust is acting on your belief that God will make a way. You will never benefit from your faith in God until you step on the bridge and start walking across. Trust is both an attitude and an action. And trusting means drawing on the inexhaustible resources of God!

Today my heart cries out "O Lord, in Thee have I trusted; let me never be confounded." What about you????

HYMN HISTORY - Be Thou My Vision

e Thou My Vision" (Old Irish: Rop tú mo baile or Rob tú mo bhoile) is a traditional Christian hymn of Irish origin. The words are based on a Middle Irish poem that has traditionally been attributed to Saint Dallán Forgaill.

The best-known English version, with some minor variations, was translated in 1905 by Mary Elizabeth Byrne in 1905, then made into verse by Eleanor Hull and published in 1912. Since 1919 it has been



commonly sung to an Irish folk tune, noted as "Slane", in Church hymnals, and is one of the most popular hymns in the United Kingdom. The original poem, found in two Irish manuscripts in the library of the Royal Irish Academy, may be dated as early as the 8th century.

Quite often, older hymns come to us as a collaborative effort before we are able to sing them from our hymnals. The Irish text, beginning "Rob tu mo bhoile, a Comdi cride," was translated into literal prose by Irish scholar Mary Byrne (1880-1931), a Dublin native, and then published in Eriú, the journal of the School of Irish Learning, in 1905. Byrne was also known for her academic publications, including Old and Mid-Irish Dictionary, Dictionary of the Irish Language, and a treatise, England in the Age of Chaucer. The original prose translation comes to us in 16 couplets.

The first is:

Be thou my vision, O Lord of my heart. None other is aught but the King of the seven heavens.

And the last is:

O heart of my heat, whate'er befall me, O ruler of all, be thou my vision.

It is at this point that **Eleanor Hull** (1860-1935) enters the story. Born in Manchester, England, she was the founder of the Irish Text Society and president of the Irish Literary Society of London. Hull versified the text and it was published in her Poem Book of the Gael (1912). Following the original publication in Ireland, the hymn Reach Out

was included in a number of British hymnals. After World War II, the hymn came to the attention of hymnal editors in the U.S. and it has become a standard hymn in most hymnals today.

Irish liturgy and ritual scholar Helen Phelan, a lecturer at the University of Limerick, points out how the language of this hymn is drawn from traditional Irish culture: "One of the essential characteristics of the text is the use of 'heroic' imagery to describe God. This was very typical of medieval Irish poetry, which cast God as the 'chieftain' or 'High King' (Ard Ri) who provided protection to his people or clan. The lorica is one of the most popular forms of this kind of protection prayer and is very prevalent in texts of this period." The original chieftain language of the "High King of heaven" has given way to the more inclusive "Great God" in the UM Hymnal.

When Hull's versification was paired with the lovely traditional Irish tune *SLANE* in The Irish Church Hymnal in 1919, its popularity was sealed. The folk melody was taken from a non-liturgical source, Patrick Weston Joyce's Old Irish Folk Music and Songs: A Collection of 842 Airs and Songs hitherto unpublished (1909). It was on Slane Hill in County Meath around 433 CE that St. Patrick lit candles on Easter Eve, defying a decree by High King Logaire of Tara that no one could light a fire before the king signaled the beginning of the pagan spring festival by lighting a fire on Tara Hill. King Logaire was so impressed by Patrick's devotion that, despite his defiance, he was permitted to continue his work as Ireland's first Christian missionary.

A medieval poem entitled "On the breaking up of a School" composed by Tadhg Og O Huiginn, c.1400, refers to the death of St. Dallán which caused his school to break up and the students to disperse as they would accept no other master. In a list of ancient Irish authors contained in the Book of Ballymote, Dallán is called "grandson of testimony".




