19. Magic Chocolate Cake (Recipe and method Provided)

Magic chocolate cake recipe

Ingredients

4 large eggs

1 tablespoon water

3/4 cup of sugar

8 tablespoon butter (unsalted and melted)

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/8 teaspoon salt

6 ½ tablespoon all-purpose flour

2 cups milk (warmed up to about 95F or 35C)

1 teaspoon vinegar (regular white vinegar) Steps

1 Prep:

Preheat oven to 160C

Line an 8x8 inch baking dish with parchment paper

2 Mix the yolks with water and sugar

Separate the eggs and add the egg yolks to the bowl of a mixer. Add a the the sugar. Beat this at high speed until the eggs are light and pale in colour

3 Drizzle in melted butter, vanilla and add salt

Add melted butter, vanilla extract and salt to the yolk mixture and continue beating until butter is fully incorporated and the mixture is light

4 Stir in the dry ingredients

Add the flour and cocoa powder to the bowl and mix thoroughly, scraping down the side and bottom of the bowl as needed.

5 Add milk

Add the milk a bit at a time and mix. The milk should be warm so not to cool the butter.

Make sure the milk has been mixed in thoroughly. The mixture should be pretty wet.

6 Whisk the egg whites

If using a handheld mixer, clean the beaters and pour the egg whites in a large clean bowl. If using a stand mixer, wash the mixing bowl and whisk attachment and make sure you dry them out. Add egg whites to mixing bowl and the vinegar and mix until egg whites are stiff

7 Add the egg whites to cake batter

Add a bit of the egg whites to chocolate mixture and gently mix using a whisk. Next reverse, and add a bit of the chocolate mixture to the egg whites, this way it will

be easier to mix everything together. Repeat until everything is mixed together and the mixture should be quite thin. Make sure to leave a distinct layer of fluffy egg white lumps at the top of the batter, so do not overmix.

8 Bake, chill and serve

Pour the batter in the prepared baking dish and bake for approximately 60 minutes or until done. The cake will still jiggle in the middle when taken out. Let it cool completely, and chill for about 4 hours letting the cake set.

9 Presentation

BUNCHES

Bunches of roses are for frontal viewing and are judged for condition, overall beauty, presentation and foliage.

BOWLS

Bowls should be the standard 15cm black plastic florist's bowls, and shall contain a mini block of oasis. Bowl exhibits shall be allowed a space of 30cm overall diameter. Arrangements can contain buds, foliage and hips (if desired), and will be viewed all round. Bowls are judged for condition, overall beauty, presentation and foliage.
