## Flag Day and the History Behind It



Flag Day is set aside to honor and commemorate the adoption of the United States flag on June 14, 1777. The day is an opportunity for Americans to reflect on the values and principles embodied by the flag, including liberty, justice, and unity.

The origins of Flag Day trace back to the late 19th century. It was first observed in 1885, when a Wisconsin schoolteacher named Bernard J. Cigrand encouraged his students to observe June 14th as “Flag Birthday” to mark the anniversary of the flag’s adoption. Over time, Cigrand’s idea gained popularity, and other communities began holding their own Flag Day celebrations.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation officially establishing June 14th as Flag Day. However, it wasn’t until August 1949 that

Congress passed legislation declaring Flag Day a national holiday.

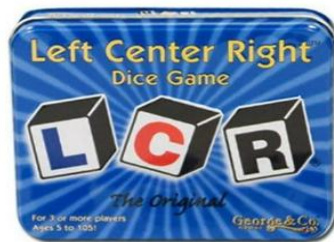


## 10 FACTS ABOUT HUMMINGBIRDS

That will change how you see them.

- 1. SHE WEIGHS LESS THAN A NICKEL.**  
Ruby-throated hummingbirds weigh 3 to 4 grams. A US nickel weighs 5. She holds her body in the air on nothing.
- 2. HER HEART BEATS 1,200 TIMES A MINUTE.**  
Yours beats 60 to 100. Hers consumes ten times more oxygen per gram of muscle than an elite human athlete.
- 3. SHE FLIES BACKWARDS.**  
Her wings rotate at the shoulder. She is the only bird that can hover dead still, reverse, and feed upside down with full control.
- 4. HER TONGUE IS NOT A STRAW.**  
It is a forked structure with grooves that snap open the moment they touch nectar — an elastic micropump that pulls liquid in faster than a straw ever could.
- 5. SHE FLEW 500 MILES NONSTOP.**  
Most ruby-throats cross the Gulf of Mexico in a single 18 to 20 hour flight, with no land below them and no rest possible.
- 6. SHE COMES BACK TO THE SAME FEEDER.**  
Banding studies have recorded the same individual hummingbird returning to the same yard for up to nine consecutive years. The bird at your feeder this May is almost certainly the bird from last May.
- 7. SHE REMEMBERS YOU.**  
Hummingbirds remember which yards have feeders, which feeders go empty, and which humans ruff them. Their spatial memory is exceptional for any animal, let alone one this small.
- 8. NEVER USE RED DYE.**  
Plain white sugar, four parts water to one part sugar. Nothing else. The red on the feeder is enough — the dye can hurt her.
- 9. CLEAN THE FEEDER EVERY 3 DAYS.**  
Sugar water grows mold and yeast fast in warm weather. A dirty feeder can kill her. Hot water and a bottle brush — no soap residue.
- 10. LEAVE THE FEEDER UP IN SEPTEMBER.**  
Late migrants and stragglers need fuel. Feeders do not delay migration — daylight does. Leave it up two weeks past your last sighting.

She's hovering at your feeder right now. Keep it clean. Skip the dye. She crossed an ocean to get back here. 🐦

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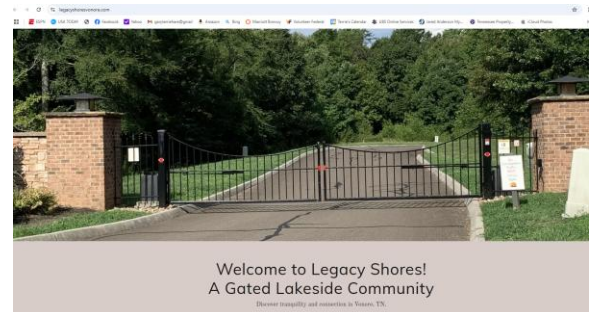
