I hope that, as we celebrate this very special Platinum Jubilee at all village celebrations, we will toast Her Majesty to continued health and happiness. I look forward to meeting everyone following my licensing to the Suffolk Heights Benefice on 21 June at St Edmunds Church, Hargrave.


#### **Rain Matters**

It should come as no surprise that April is a dry month in Chevington. The average for April over the last ten years has been just 24.5mm. Of course, nature being what it is, if you take the average for the last 11 years, that average goes up to 33mm, because 2012 had a very wet April indeed – 119mm. April 2007 holds the record for the driest month in all my records at 0.25mm, and that may have been a measurement error. It could well have been zero.

So, around the end of April there are nearly always dark mutterings of a drought. At 10.25mm (0.4 inches) for the whole month there was some justification for such forebodings. It was as if Nature had said "Ready, steady...." and forgotten to say Go. Plants and lawns had put their heads above ground and then simply stopped growing or at least slowed to a near standstill. The temperature was not exactly balmy and we were getting the worst of both worlds – chilly and dry.

But a dry April does not seem to mean a dry summer. In the summer of the first lockdown, we had a dry April and an even drier May (just 2mm) but then an average of some 70mm a month through to October. Last year too we averaged over 60mm from May to October after just 3.5mm in April.



#### Ramblings of a Reader

**W**hat a celebratory month this purports to be, as our communities give thanks for the 70 glorious years of Her Majesty's reign in diverse and joyful festivities, which doubtless will include the eating of the Platinum Pudding!

The Platinum Jubilee weekend coincides with the Church's celebration of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit was imparted to the embryonic Christian community. As Queen Elizabeth holds the title of 'Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England' the significance of this double celebration will not be lost on her. Her faith has been her rock and anchor in times of both joy and sorrow, for which we give thanks.

I have to confess that 61 years ago I would appear to have played truant and missed a day of school – 17 May 1961 to be exact (I assume my parents did get the Head teacher's permission!) This was the occasion of the Consecration of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Spirit, Guildford, attended by the Queen and Prince Philip. My sister and I waved our streamers as Her Majesty made her way up Stag Hill to the great edifice at its summit. Such an impressive sight – not quite the same today, with the University of Surrey replacing the once verdant pastures. Patiently, we waited the hour and 45 minutes for her Majesty to re-emerge (it was a fine day) and we dutifully waved our streamers again. Then, on the advice of my father (a Steward inside the Cathedral administering the sound system for the service) we ran back up towards the cathedral and down the copious steps on the south side so that we could wave again to the royal guests. I like to think that she might remember those two little girls waving enthusiastically - as we were the only ones there. My mother was not so speedy!

Copious steps reminds me of the Pilgrimage of Song last month, that wound its way from Chevington, o'er field and dell, to the Cathedral neath the royal blue sky. Some eight miles in total – but such wonderful hospitality en route. With thanks to the vision and brilliant organising skills of Paul, Jane, Sally, Richard and the former rector. Perhaps we should have called it the Platinum Pilgrimage of Song! Our voices can resound with these words of Richard Gillard

We are pilgrims on a journey, Fellow travellers on the road; We are here to help each other Walk the mile and bear the load.

A week prior to VE Day 2022 a group of 20 people joined in the third of the walking tours around the former areas used by R.A.F personnel between 1942-1946 for living, relaxing, learning, playing, socialising and working at R.A.F. Chedburgh. The 10 sites away from the airfield form the basis for the walks and give an indication of the vast area used to house about 1,800 personnel, and the conditions they would have had to face.

I am grateful for the co-operation of Mr. Wimpress and Jon Cardy for allowing our group onto their land which is normally not accessible to the public. To see some of the former buildings and artifacts found over the years made the subject more understandable as so much of the area has now returned to nature and requires a great deal of imagination and help from map references.

I would like to thank the Councillors of Chedburgh Parish Council for the gift of two large detailed official WD maps of the airfield and the accommodation areas, which will be a constant reminder of the contribution to the war effort made by the gallant servicemen and women of the R.A.F. and W.A.A.F at RAF Chedburgh.

At some stage I hope to arrange a visit to the airfield itself with the approval of the land owners. If this is something you would like to do please let me know and I will talk to the farmers who have quite a lot of information of interest.

#### The Chevington Churchyard Management Project





The Management Project is pretty much in place for this year. The swift boxes are up and a calling system has been placed in the bell tower which plays out the sound of swift calls in the morning and evening and is meant to

attract the birds to the tower. However, we cannot realistically expect swifts to come here this year. The quickest recorded response to a calling system is one hour. The slowest is seven years.

Meanwhile on the ground the paths round the church yard have been cut and with one or two small alterations following local requests will remain as such all year round, while the rest of the grass will be cut in July and September and then raked off a week later. We hope to do this on the weekend of 9th-10th July and then have a raking party on **Sunday 17th July**. The grass, having lain on the sward for a week should have dropped its seed and we can rake it into a pile – and cart some of it away. The important thing is not to let it lie too long which would enrich the ground, making it harder for wild flowers to thrive.

The grass cuttings are mostly being put in the brown bin to be taken away by the council, but we are creating grass heaps in partial shade at the east end of the church yard. These could take a year or two to form but may with a combination of cuttings, long grass and some brush from hedge clippings provide a home for grass snakes and frogs, toads, slugs and maybe hedgehogs.

We have also done a brief survey of flowers found in flower in May in the churchyard. We will try to a similar survey every month. If anyone discovers anything we have not seen, please let us know.

#### THE SECOND SLEEP

#### by Robert Harris

I have previously read several Robert Harris novels and enjoy the 'What if' scenario he often portrays. What if Germany had won the war, as in Fatherland for example? The Second Sleep follows in that genre of what might have happened if circumstances had been different.

Set in the Year of our Risen Lord 1468 in and around the Wessex village of Addicott St George. Father

Christopher Fairfax is sent by his Bishop to bury Father Thomas Lacy, the previous incumbent. Lacy having been found dead at the foot of a local landmark; an earthwork called The Devil's Chair. The service is disrupted by a stranger who is bundled out of the church. Fairfax becomes curious and embarks on a series of unexplained discoveries.

The best way to enjoy this book is not to read about it beforehand, so you may want to stop reading now, it's your choice.

In the parsonage, Fairfax finds books from the Society of Antiquarians (established 1707), which he does not properly understand. He finds a letter listing six possible causes of the Apocalypse, not just the four he is familiar with from the Book of Revelation. Similar books had been burned as heretical in the past and considered dangerous stuff. He finds strange objects – glass of a clarity and smoothness he has never seen before; and what is the little flat thing with the image of a bitten apple?

He soon finds other people equally curious, including Lady Durston and Captain Hancock. They travel to Axford Corn Exchange (in 1468 remember) to attend a lecture given by Dr Shadwell, a travelling scholar, and the disrupter of Father Lacy's funeral.

Shadwell's performance is broken up by local sheriffs who arrest him as a heretic, although he is subsequently bailed into the custody of Hancock. All four return to Addicott and immediately set about excavating the cursed Devil's Chair. Against the odds they make several discoveries; but never find out what happened in 2025 and why the apple had a bite taken from it.

Thoroughly enjoyable, available from Suffolk Libraries.

#### THE DREADED WORKHOUSE

Even into living memory nothing struck terror into the heart of a working person like the thought of going in to the workhouse. These evolved from the Poor Laws of 1601 which made parishes responsible for looking after their own poor. Originally administered via grants of food, clothing, food or fuel by 1723, the Workhouse Test Act meant the poor would only be offered a place in the workhouse instead. At first these were just cottages rented for that purpose. Up to 1834 most parishes provided their own workhouse, or poorhouse as they were more often called in the countryside. In Whepstead

it was on the corner where Pages Hill Road meets Church Hill – in spring, you can still see bulbs there that were once in the gardens. In Hartest it is at the top of the aptly named, Poorhouse Hill as you leave the village to go to Brockley. The workhouse in Horringer was once the Guildhall and is today a pretty thatched cottage.

Following a reorganisation in 1834 the Thingoe Poor Law Union came into being in 1836. This took over

provision of providing for the destitute from 45 surrounding parishes, including our own. The new building in Mill Lane, Bury, could accommodate 300 inmates and cost £5,000 (apparently worth over £692,000 in today's money).

The whole workhouse/poorhouse system was intended to discourage the workshy or the 'un-needy poor' from applying for help. If an able-bodied man wished to enter the workhouse his whole family had to come with him!

If you became too ill or old to work, or could not find a job, you would be placed in these places which were designed to be draconian as a discouragement. Married couples, even the very elderly, were separated from each other and children, except for the very youngest, were separated from their parents except for perhaps an hour or two on Sundays.

By the 1850s most of the workhouse inmates were old, infirm, orphaned, unmarried mothers and the physically and mentally ill. Hard labour, spartan conditions and poor food were the order of the day. To be placed in the workhouse was the ultimate degradation.

However, not everyone stayed there permanently, some left when seasonal jobs became available only to return and put back

on the rough uniform again when work dried up. By the end of the century, following criticism from Florence Nightingale and *The Lancet* medical journal, they had become less harsh and inmates were let out occasionally and allowed treats such as newspapers.

Workhouse hospitals which were staffed by untrained female workhouse residents were replaced with proper 'fever' hospitals and children began to be placed in specialist homes. Asylums were set up for the mentally insane.

Locally, in 1907 the union was amalgamated with the Bury Union. The Thingoe buildings became the St Mary's geriatric hospital. Many elderly people in this area, in living memory, used to refuse to go to there due to its association with the workhouse.

Most of it has now been demolished and replaced with modern housing. The Bury union's inmates moved into the Mill Lane site and only part of the old Bury site can still be seen in College Street.

More generally, in the 1930s workhouse unions were abolished and their duties taken over by local authorities. Again, conditions for inmates were slightly relaxed. After WWII the NHS took over these places and ran them as hospitals (see above) and it wasn't until the 1980s and beyond that these gloomy buildings were mainly demolished.




Figure 2 Site map of Thingoe Workhouse

Today social service benefits take the place of the workhouse for most in need and for the mentally ill, the so-called "Care in the Community" is provided. However, as one distinguished guest on Radio 4's "Word of Mouth" pointed out recently, the major part of the care is actually provided by police forces and prisons, at least in the US. The prison reformer, James Timpson (of Timpson's Shoes fame) has said that about one-third of the British prison population is of the mentally ill, so for

some there is not much improvement...

Annie's Plant of the Month for May was Smynium

Perfoliatum. She had brought along a couple of stems in full flower, and told us how, although it can take several years to get to this stage, if it is happy in a position it will happily self-seed. Patience is necessary, and a good memory to know where it is, as it dies back every year, and would be easy to dig up. A lovely bright addition to the garden though.

We had been waiting for a couple of years to hear Sally Hepher talk on "Wish I'd Known When I Started Out", and we were lucky to have her come to us in the last week of doing her talks. She described her journey into gardening, and all the things that can happen to a gardener as they learn from their mistakes. She talked about soil, mulches, lawns, plants, hedges, pests and intruding animals, weeds, equipment and clothing. I'm sure many of us recognised some of the pitfalls!

We are now into our season of evening visits replacing meetings in the Institute. Our first, on June 6th, is to Smallwood Farmhouse, Bradfield St. George.
