### Let's Get College-Ready!



We believe education is critical to success. As a result, we host our annual "Let's Get College-Ready" workshop to inform and position students to successfully apply and matriculate to college. Preparing and applying to college and scholarships can be overwhelming. Our goal is to make the process more manageable by informing them of resources, tips, information, and critical dates so they can have a smoother, less stressful application process.



Students and parents rotated through four stations and learned about Financial Aid, finding scholarships, the college application process and then actually scoring an scholarship application to understand the process and avoid errors. The main takeaways from this workshop were:

1. Start early, know how to get a copy of your transcript and be in consistent communication with your counselor and teachers for letters of recommendation 2. Use resources available to you to avoid going in circles- Naviance, Collegeboard.org, Gafutures.org 3. Let someone else review and

edit your application, essays and videos before you submit. Please do not be afraid or turn away from comments and suggested edits. 4. Scholarships are everywhere! how to become the WRS. 1. The Power of the Counselor! Schedule to meet your counselor (parent and student). Let them know who you are and your interests. They are there to help, but with so many students on their list, the students who makes a point to know their counselor can reap the most benefits (info on jobs, internships, scholarships etc.) 2. Create a resume/scholar profile, volunteer and join extracurricular activities. Being involved helps develop social, communication and leadership skills. 3. Take a headshot for resume/profile 4. # In Memory of Mrs. Theresa Story


