The focus of this workshop was to equip students with the tools needed to be the WRS. The WRS knows their GPA, has a good relationship with his/her counselor, is involved in after school programs or sports and volunteers in their community. Ms. Merriweather, Career, Technical and Agriculture Education (CTAE) educator and Future Health Professionals Organization (HOSA) program lead and Mrs. Watkins, Counselor, both from Langston Hugues High School, and Mrs. Stacey Grundy, ZH volunteer, facilitated. The workshop covered the importance of extracurricular activities, volunteering in your community and how counselors help students on their journey.

Students also completed their student profile, which acts as their resume. Photos Unlimited (Ricardo Ivory) was onsite to capture headshots for their student profiles. The workshop was a HUGE success and engrained in students a better understanding

of what it means and takes to be a WRS and how to make the most of their current a successful college admission outcome.

Social Media: The Good, Bad, and Super Ugly, 9.25.21

Teens and adults alike are using social media now more than ever due to the pandemic. ZH and Distinguished Young Ladies (DYL) hosted this important workshop to sustain efforts to keep our students and parents informed and safe online. Our amazing speakers were Mr. Harris, new Langston Hughes High Principal, DJ Beelax, Social Media Influencer, Attorney Trinity Townsend, Toni Tennyson Smith, counselor, and Ms. Lydia Sermons, engaged parent. Some important takeaways from this workshop were: 1. Schools can discipline students for what they post online after school hours (nudes, fights, threats, bullying, etc.). Don't' keep pictures or videos of fights, nudes or threats on your phone. DELETE images and tell your school administrator of threats. 2. Students can be charged with crimes for cyberbullying, cyberstalking, fighting, threats, child pornography (sending semi or nude pictures of other students). 4. Students and adults can lose jobs, opportunities, scholarships, admissions etc.

Let's Get College-Ready! 10.16.21



ZH and DYL are always excited to help prepare our students to successfully apply to college and for scholarships. Our phenomenal speakers were Ms. Marnessa Vital, Executive Director of GRASP Inc., Mrs. Tahira Chandler, New Manchester High school AVID and Math Teacher and yours truly, Bernice Bronson. The important points from this workshop were:

- 1. Start your process early! Do not wait until your senior year to look at your grades or join after school activities or to volunteer. Great grades alone will not get you acceptance or scholarships! 2. Communicate regularly with your counselors 3. Ask for letters of recommendations 3-4 weeks in advance and follow up. YOU need their help! 3. Let 1-2 other qualified people read your essay. DO NOT hit submit until someone else has read your essay and provided feedback.
- 4. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA) EARLY and make no mistakes. Mistakes on the application will move you to the end of the line. Complete on laptop/computer, NOT phone. Colleges have different FAFSA

deadlines. The FAFSA provides 10 slots to add the schools to which you are applying. Use all 10.

5. Volunteer and participate in extracurricular activities starting in the 9th or earlier. 6. The 9 black sororities and fraternities known as THE DIVINE 9 give scholarships! Google all nine serving the city you live in and apply. For example, Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority in CITY you live in and see what comes up. Do for all 9! 7. There are scholarships for everyone! (C student, twins, left-handed, first-generation college student)! Do your research! Check out www.avwsf.org.

We asked Verla why she decided to support ZH. "I strongly believe in supporting and encouraging motivated young people as they start to develop their professional and personal interests. I have always loved young people, especially because of their idealism and enthusiasm. "I know from personal experience the difference that encouragement from a trusted person and learned coping skills make when a young person is uncertain about an important decision, or is about to give up on their dreams."
