


The purpose of the workshop was to educate and inform our community, particularly our young people on the criminal justice system and especially how to protect our children from ever entering the system. Madam District Attorney for Fulton County shared some of her team's new diversion programs and approaches to handling young, first-time offenders. Moderators Mr. Greathouse and Mr. Townsend took questions from the chat box for the panel to answer. Lt. Pittman recommended that all students (ages 10-14) get ID from their local police station. Make sure to bring proof of residence.

If we can leave youth and parents with the top 5 takeaways from the presentation to remember, they are:

- 1. 7 deadly sins/crimes of Georgia: 1. murder, 2. rape, 3. voluntary manslaughter, 4. aggravated child molestation, 5. aggravated sexual battery, 6. aggravated sodomy, 7. armed robbery with a firearm
- 2. A 13-year-old can be tried as an adult if he/she commits any of the 7 deadly crimes.
- 3. Students should have 5 trusted adults in their circle.
- 4. If your child unknowingly participates in a crime, you will need to get a good lawyer to prove that he/she was unaware of the crime that was committed.
- 5. Don't shun public defenders (an attorney appointed to the defendant if he/she can't afford one). They can and usually work really hard for the defendant but stay engaged in the process.
