#### LIFE'S ESSENTIALS Workshops to INFORM and EMPOWER

#### The Law & YOU!



This year we hosted our Law and You Workshop as part of the Takeover Student Conference sponsored by Westlake High School. Close to twenty students attended and were thoroughly engaged in the panel discussion, featuring our Dream Team of speakers: Judge Shermela Williams, Attorneys Riah Greathouse Trinity Townsend, and Ms. Shelly Faulk, and Officer Jason Cade. The major takeaways from this session were, 1. A felony is a serious offense and punishment ranges from 12 months to life. 2. 13-year-olds can be tried as adults. 3. SEVEN-DEADLY-SINS LAW 1. murder, 2. rape, 3. aggravated sexual battery, 4. aggravated

sodomy, 5. aggravated child molestation, 6. armed robbery, 7. kidnapping.

Students role-played with Officer Cade to understand how crime and punishment works. Additionally, six students won the quide-

book When the Cops come Knockin': Guide to Criminal Law authored by Attorneys and brothers Trinity and Travis Townsend. The session ended with Judge Shermela having the students take the following pledge:"I will think my choices through and make smart decisions to stay OUT of the

system." We encourage parents to have discussions with their kids about the law and the justice system AND have them take the pledge. There's something to speaking it out and affirming your stance!

positive feedback about the impact Zena's House continues to have in our youth community.
