

#### The Law and YOU!

Zena's House and our community partners: Union City Mayor, Vince Williams, Union City Police Department and Next Level Boys Academy, hosted the Law and You workshop at the Gathering Place in Union City on February 29, 2020. It was an engaging, thought-provoking workshop on the law and its impact on the African American community.

The workshop began with a compilation of videos of news clips about notable crimes committed by local youth, snippets from an episode of TV One's, For My Man, and an informational video about Gary Davis' diversion program (Next Level Boys Academy). Participants had the opportunity to attend two sessions: one centered around the justice system, with panel members including, Judge Ronald Freeman, Union City; Sergeant R. Pittman-Delancey, Union City Police; Dejaesic Zellers, Creekside High School Resource Officer, and facilitator, Judge Fani Willis.

Panel members in the second session discussed the social impacts of the law in the community, and included Gary Davis, Portia Summers-Thurston (Parent), Dr. RJ Verwayne (Clinical Psychologist), and Attorney and ZH Board member, Riah Greathouse, who served as the session facilitator. Students and parents gave personal accounts of their encounters with the legal system, as well as sought advice from panel members on how to stay out of the criminal justice system. Officer Davis also shared the importance of parents telling their kids they love them. One participant stated, "I learned a lot of great information that I will apply to my life from both sessions today."

Workshop attendees also met author, Trinity Townsend, who had available for purchase the book he co-authored, titled 'When the Cops Come Knockin' – an illustrated guide to criminal law, a must-have every home library. The ladies of Alpha Kappa Alpha Tau Epsilon Omega Chapter were also on hand to assist attendees with voter registration.

The afternoon concluded with all guests being treated to pizza donated and served by OZ Pizza, the announcement of raffle winners and participants completing a quick online survey about the workshop. The surveys reveal that session goers departed armed, not only with increased legal knowledge, but some new life skills, which include: 1. Spend quality time with your kids, know their friends and parents and keep them active and engaged in after school programs. (clubs, sports, etc,) 2. Learn how your kids best respond to you (yelling and nagging is not always the best solution). These simple suggestions can make THE difference between being in the system and freedom. #stayoutofthesystem

Seven **AMAZING** ladies and myself answered the call to be Coach mentors— **Taleesha B, Chaunta F, Kathy G, Stacey G, Katrina S, Felicia T, and Danielle V.** Mentors were interviewed, trained and matched with the students. Interestingly, our mentees comprised of six young men and two young ladies. At the kick-off in August, parents, students

young men and two young ladies. At the kick-off in August, parents, students and mentors met and and learned a little about each other and the mentorship began. Mentors were to check in with their student at least twice a month.

After a few months, we realized that calls or texts alone was not enough, so we implemented monthly lunch and learns where we would meet our students at school during lunch– provide lunch, get and give updates and encouragement. We also emailed teachers, met with students and parents face-to-face outside of school, reviewed progress reports, assisted with scholarship applications, wrote recommendation letters, etc. They were also given

assignments to include preparing a scholar profile and creating a parchment account to send us their official transcripts. Students earned surprise \$5 cash app rewards for completing assignments, etc. At times, we got a little firm with them to get them on track. Additionally, we encouraged them to attend ZH sponsored events such as our scholarship and law and you workshops. In February, we had a fun outing at Dave & Busters with students, parents and mentors. We enjoyed the time to further bond, share, eat and

play games.

During the shelter-in-place mandate, we held our lunch and learns via Zoom (thanks to Sensoury for the suggestion). Our ultimate goal was to ensure that our students graduate and developed an after high school plan. Some of our students have been accepted into 4-year colleges, technical college and or will receive training or certifications. We are very proud of them and grateful for the support from their parents, grandparents, aunts and Creekside staff, Principal Pollock, Dr. Maria Bazile, Mrs. Yolanda Magee, counselors and teachers. #village
