Why capture rainwater?

Rain barrels are an excellent way to help the environment in urban areas because they reduce storm water runoff, which can carry pollutants and sediment directly to creeks and rivers. In addition, heavy rains can impact local sanitary sewer systems by increasing the gallons per day of wastewater a facility must treat.

Nothing goes to waste!

All 55-gallon rain barrels are recycled food-grade drums once used to carry food products such as olives and pickles.
