November 12: Diwali is the Hindu festival of lights with its variations also celebrated in other Indian religions. It symbolizes the spiritual "victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance".

December 7 – 15: Hanukkah is a Jewish festival commemorating the recovery of Jerusalem and subsequent rededication of the Second Temple at the beginning of the Maccabean Revolt against the Seleucid Empire in the 2nd century BCE. It celebrates the triumph of light over darkness and freedom to worship.

December 8: Bodhi Day is the Buddhist holiday that commemorates the day that Gautama Buddha is said to have attained enlightenment, also known as bodhi in Sanskrit and Pali.

December 26 – January 1: Kwanzaa is an annual celebration of African-American culture from December 26 to January 1, culminating in a communal feast called Karamu, usually on the sixth day. It was created

by activist Maulana Karenga, based on African harvest festival traditions from various parts of West and Southeast Africa.

December 25: Christmas is an annual Christian holiday commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ, observed primarily on December 25 as a religious and cultural celebration among billions of people around the world.

Boyce Road Info:

Boyce Road closure continues as PennDOT's contractor resumes work as of March. Closures and detours will occur until work is completed around November 8, 2022. There are two alternating closure combinations due to switch from the current configuration to the new one in August. Right now, one can drive west on Boyce from Rt19 right up to the construction intersection and then turn right on Mayview and head to Bridgeville. As of August 22 or thereabouts, the western part (our part) of Boyce will be open to the construction intersection and you'll be able to turn south (right) on Mayview and head for Lawrence. The eastern part of Boyce, however, will be closed from Rt.19 (open only for local traffic only). Finally, the Social Committee has decided to reduce the cost and impact of paper communication to homeowners this year by going to a digital communication process of emails and postings to the website.

On a totally different subject, you may have noticed that the trees in the front of our properties, referred to as our "street trees," were the only planting beds that did not get a coating of mulch this year. In our Landscaping Chairperson Noli Cruz' words, "We are currently working on our community trees. To promote good health and prevent disease, we have been advised by a tree professional to decrease the amount of mulch around the bottom of the trees. We are looking for other options on how to dress up the bottom of the trees. The Board and the Landscaping Committee are in the process of addressing this issue. Thank you for your patience." Thought you'd like to know what was going on with our tree planting beds.

A request or two have come into the Board from homeowners for a new street light to increase lighting near their home. We thought a little bit of history could add some perspective to this topic. Three or four years ago the Board began planning to improve the street lighting along Clubview Drive. The South Fayette Township Police Department was contacted and asked to evaluate the lighting conditions on our

street. With its recommendations in our possession, we asked the Township to add four new lights to our street as well as relocate several existing poles for better illumination. At that time we learned that the electric company had a list of requirements an arm long that we would have to meet, the Township had approval rights since they pay the electric bill for the lights and we would have to pay to dig the trenches for the conduit to carry the electric wire to the light pole bases that we had to secure. Oh, and we also had to pay the electric company for their engineers to come out to our street and tell us exactly what we needed to do. Years of hounding the electric company through the township (we weren't allowed to contact the electric company directly) and several thousand dollars later, we have new street lights and several more gray hairs (thanks to Tracey Valko and Fred Rapone for their steadfast and unrelenting drive to complete this project). We still haven't heard from the Township and electric company about relocating the several poles yet. All of this is offered to inform any homeowner who asks the Board of Directors for a new street light. It ain't easy or fast!

And finally, some info about the Boyce Road closure in case you haven't yet found your way to the South Fayette Township webpage that deals with this project. Various routes of access have been made available or are planned for the future as the project work progresses. It will be interesting to see if the projected completion date of November 8, 2022 holds up as they totally re-engineer the intersection of Boyce and Mayview Roads. That's it for now. And pick up the garbage around your driveway after a windy garbage pickup day! Cheers!
