Technical Events

Track renewal with Embedded Rail System (ERS) in semi-precast panels in New Zealand's North Island (February 2023)

Mr Miguel Peña (Edilon Sedra)

The requirements of KiwiRail for the renewal of track in Tunnel 7 of the North Island Main Trunk (NIMT) made Edilon Sedra offer a very specific solution: Embedded Rail System in semi-precast panels. This solution offers all the advantages of the ERS and concrete precasting while keeping material and equipment logistics to a minimum.

Aurizon's Automated Track Inspection System (ATIS) (November 2022)

Aurizon is currently implementing an Automated Track Inspection System (ATIS). ATIS is a collection of systems – locomotive-mounted hardware, software and business processes – which acquires, analyses and uses track geometry and OHLE condition monitoring data to inform asset management and maintenance planning activities. The program has been in development since 2020 and is now in its implementation phase which is planned to complete in mid-2023. The presentation will provide an overview of the ATIS system, implementation progress and expected outcomes and benefits.

Cross River Rail – Tunnel Station Development (July 2022)

Alex presented an overview of the challenges, achievements, and delivery of Queensland's largest infrastructure project, Brisbane's Cross River Rail, Tunnel & Station Development with some light hearted history on tunnelling in the UK.



Preparing SEQ's rail network for the future: Logan and Gold Coast Faster Rail project update (October 2022)

Logan and Gold Coast Faster Rail (LGC) Project Director, Liz Schofield, provided an update on this priority rail project connecting our growing communities with more frequent and reliable train services between Brisbane, Logan, and the Gold Coast. The project includes increasing the number of tracks from 2 to 4 between Kuraby and Beenleigh, modernised rail systems, station upgrades, and level crossing removals. LGC is part of the Queensland Government's record investment in rail as outlined in SEQ Rail Connect.
