Menifee's first School, located on Bradley Road, South of Newport Road. Children sat on long wooden benches. Some walked, others arrived on horseback or buggy.






Photo early 1900's






Photo circa 1975






Photo circa late 1940's






Photo date: 1894-1895

Sadly, it was cut down a few years ago by the new owners.






Photo date: around 1900

Cleo Judson owned this well rig and dug many wells in the valley. Charlie Bailey was the local "water witcher". His stick would point down when water was nearby.






Photo date: late 1950's

Not to be confused with nearby Canyon Lake.






Photo date: approx. 1930's






Photo date: December 31, 1915

William Newport Ranch. The tree-shaded entrance was located near present day Kay Ceniceros Ctr., and was over 17,000 acres according to his daughter Kathryn.





Photo date: 1896

Menifee School was built in 1890 on SW cor Newport & Bradley Roads. In 1896 the Menifee School served 20 students, the same number as when Menifee and Antelope Schools unified in 1952.





Photo date: 1910

The Henry Evans home located along Salt Creek, now the east end of Canyon lake. He sold 1,100 acres to Temescal Water Co. They constructed the dam that created Railroad Canyon Lake.

Antelope School 8th grade. Jerry Devine, James Wickerd, Ronnie Kay, Elinor Evans, Nancy McGrath & Rose Wickerd. The 1-room school with 8 grades was on SW corner of Scott & Antelope roads
