




Photo date: Early 1960's

Photo date: mid-1960's


Aerial view looking south from Ethanac Road toward Sun City while it was being constructed. Merle Zeiders' home as marked on the photo was later moved.

William Newport's sprawling ranch was located north of Newport road between Bradley road and Murrieta road. His family and ranch hands lived on the property.






Photo date: 1880's
