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
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BUSY DAY ...

The Grand Opening of the Everglades Area Visitor Center at **207 West Broadway** was on Febuary 1, 2020, with a plethora of dignitaries to wish us well.

There was obviously a need for a place that tourists could get information about what to do in our locality after the Chamber of Commerce was dissolved so ESHP stepped up to fill the gap and promote our historic area.

We also made space for artists to display and sell their work but we decided not to compete with local businesses.

When the old **Bank of Everglades Building** has been rehabilitated, the Visitor Center & Trail Town HQ will be downstairs with more space for displays, information racks, and artwork. The original vault will become a theater showing the film "Wind Across the Everglades" which was made around Everglades City in 1957 with some locals acting as extras.

GOOD NEWS!

The Federal omnibus funding bill for Fiscal Year 2023 which was passed by Congress and signed by the President just before Christmas includes **funding for our Bank of**



Everglades Building project, thanks to our local representative Congressman Mario Diaz-Balart who submitted an appropriation of \$3million for us.

The grant is from the Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) as part of their Community Projects.

These Federal funds will cover the costs of stabilizing the foundation and other structural issues. We anticipate that the total project to rehabilitate the Bank of Everglades Building will be closer to \$5 million so we will continue to fundraise and apply for state and private grants.

100 YEARS AGO ...

We're not the only ones celebrating a Centennial. Hendry County was also established in 1923 with LaBelle as its seat. It was cut out of Lee County



because residents in the eastern part of the area complained that Ft Myers was too far away

The legislation went through on May 11 that year so Collier County is older by 3 days!

The history is similar to ours. The road across the State connecting Ft Myers and Palm Beach (now SR-80) was completed in 1926. The Courthouse in LaBelle was finished in 1927 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

A Bank was founded in 1922 and moved to a new building in 1925. Business suffered in 1927 after the land boom collapsed and the Bank was dissolved in 1937. The building became shops and lodging.

The new County was named after Francis A. Hendry, a cattle rancher and large landowner who settled the area in the 1890s. You can listen to a self-guided walking tour online at <u>www.citylabelle.com</u>, click on Community.
