President Patty Huff gave an update on what ESHP has been doing and Marya Repko talked about the life of the great man who founded our County in 1923 when he was just 50 years old and already a multi-millionaire.

It was an enjoyable event with delicious cake, champagne, and a successful raffle. Our thanks to the Lighthouse Club at Everglades Isle for providing the venue and to Kathy Brock who donated beautiful orchid plants that she grew herself to help raise funds.

March is Women's History Month

We owe a thank-you to **Tommie Barfield**, the "Queen of Marco", who pushed the legislation in Tallahassee that created Collier County. She was also the first Superintendent of Schools.

Another prominent local woman was **Mamie Smallwood** who started the road from Everglades to Chokoloskee. Unfortunately, World War I intervened and work stopped on what is now Plantation Parkway.

Women played a large part in pioneer life but are generally not appreciated for the hardship they endured back when there was little infrastructure in our wilderness.


News from Naples

Vísítor Center


